





Women's History: Ida B. Wells

An amazing woman who was both a civil rights and women's rights activist was Afro-American Ida B. Wells. She was born into slavery in Holly Springs, Mississippi. She was freed by the Emancipation Proclamation during the Civil War.

She lost both her parents and a baby brother to the yellow fever epidemic when she was 16. She taught at a school while raising her siblings with the help of her grandmother.

At 19, with her two youngest sisters, she moved to Memphis where she lived with an aunt and taught school. She lost her teaching job because she would criticize schools and the way they did things. She went into journalism and became an investigative reporter for several papers. During this time, she kept up with

her education, eventually graduating from Rust College and later Fisk University.

As a reporter, Wells wrote several articles about the lynching that was taking place all over the South. As a result, her office and the presses were destroyed. She moved to Chicago and later was one of the founders of the NAACP and was a newspaper editor.

She travelled nationally and internationally speaking about civil rights and women's rights. She died in 1931 at the age of 69.

She was posthumously honored with a Pulitzer Prize special citation for her outstanding and courageous reporting on the horrific and vicious violence against African Americans during the era of lynching.

First Vice President

The First Vice President shall perform the duties of the President in her absence or at her request. She shall assist the President in all duties, with the purpose of preparing to assume the office of President at the conclusion of the President's term or terms in office. Should the President be nominated for a second term, the election shall be unopposed or against the First Vice President. No other nominations will be accepted for this position. Should the President not seek a second term, the First Vice President shall assume the Presidency.

Current First Vice President: None.

Second Vice President

The Second Vice President shall perform the duties of the First Vice President in her absence or at her request. She shall coordinate all committees.

Current Second Vice President: Arleen Prusienski

Treasurer

The Treasurer shall collect and receive all monies and deposit same in a bank approved by the Executive Officers, in the name of the Marlton Woman's Club, Inc. She shall render statement of accounts to the Board of Directors and to the Club at the regular Club meetings. She shall pay all approved bills. She shall co-sign all Club checks with the President. She shall notify, in writing, any members whose dues and/or other monies are outstanding. She shall serve on the Budget committee. She shall file an annual report

audit in June. She shall inventory all Club property. The inventory list shall be updated each year with a copy to be filed with the Treasurer in the Club Ledger. All Club property (e.g. tent, camera, etc.) shall be logged in and out with the Club Treasurer.

Recording Secretary

The Recording Secretary shall keep typewritten minutes of the General Business, Board of Directions and Special Meetings. Within two weeks of the meeting, copies of these minutes should be distributed accordingly. At the end of the club year the board, general business and special meetings minutes shall become a permanent record.

Corresponding Secretary

The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the Club except where otherwise designated in these bylaws. She is responsible for holding the key to the Post Office Box and is required to visit the box at least twice a month prior to the Board and General Membership meetings. She shall be responsible for filing a copy of all correspondence requiring club action and a copy or record of all outgoing correspondence. She shall read any Officer's or Chairman's Report in their absence unless otherwise designated.
