ECF provides New Jersey families facing the crisis of pediatric cancer a place to turn for comfort and support through professional in-home counseling and a uniquely tailored package of assistance – all free of charge. Each year, ECF helps hundreds of families in New Jersey with a free package of support services. They assist any New Jersey family with a child who has cancer ages 0-18, regardless of race, creed, socioeconomic status, or any other demographic restriction. They continue helping the families for as long as they need it, whether it be one month or 10 years. There are no applications, forms, or other red tape for a family to deal with they strive to make the delivery of services as quick and seamless as possible. To date, ECF has assisted over 2000 families. This project replaces the Special State Project for 2020-2022 Operation Chillout.



# **GFWC** Legislative Action Center

On March 16, the House of Representatives, by a bipartisan vote of 345-73, approved H.R. 485, the Stronger Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act (CAPTA). Now it is time for the Senate to act to reauthorize the programs, and for both the House and Senate Appropriations Committees to provide \$750 million to increase funding for the Community-Based Child Abuse Prevention grants. This crucial investment in American families will support resources at the local community level which mitigate the many challenges and stress which parents and caregivers are facing right now, such as decreased wages or loss of work, lack of childcare, and housing instability.



This Memorial Day, share a poem for those who lost their lives in service to their nation: In Flanders Fields, written by Canadian John McCrae, MD, who served as a soldier and surgeon in the Canadian Army during World War I. The poem was inspired by the killing of his friend and former militia pal, Lt. Alexis Helmer, during the Second Battle of Ypres. The poem was written in 1915, and first published in the magazine Punch. McCrae would die some three years later from pneumonia as WWI was coming to an end.
