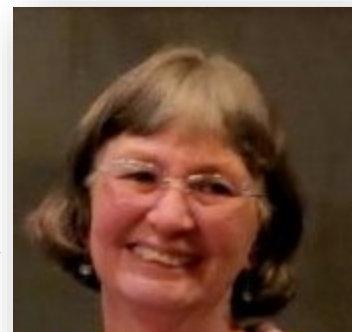

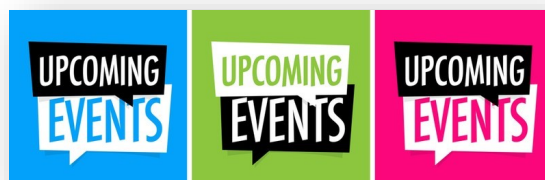

Women's History

November is Native American Heritage Month. **Susan LaFlesche Picotte** (Iron Eye) has earned her spot in history.

At the age of eight years old, she witnessed an ailing, dying Indian woman of her Omaha tribe. The white doctor refused to go to the reservation to treat the woman so she died. It was right then and there that she decided she wanted to become a doctor to help all people, white or Indian.



She spent many years at the mission school. At that time, formal medical training was rare for women and unheard of for Indian women. But in her teens she left Nebraska and went to Elizabeth, New Jersey to study at the Elizabeth School. She persisted forcefully and on March 14, 1889, at the age of 24, she graduated as valedictorian of her medical class from the Woman's Medical College of Pennsylvania.

She returned to her Omaha tribe in Nebraska and treated and cared for anyone who needed medical attention. In 1913, she built and opened a hospital without any government assistance in Walthill, Nebraska. She worked there delivering babies and treating all kinds of diseases.

Unfortunately, she was not in good health and on September 18, 1915 she passed away at the age of 49.

Today, there is the Susan LaFlesche Picotte Memorial Hospital in Walthill, Nebraska dedicated in her honor for all the good work she did.

A quote she is known for in the beginning of her pursuit to become a doctor:

"We are only beginning so do not try to put us down but help us to climb higher."

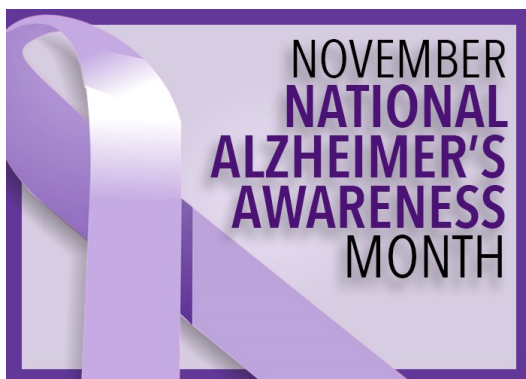

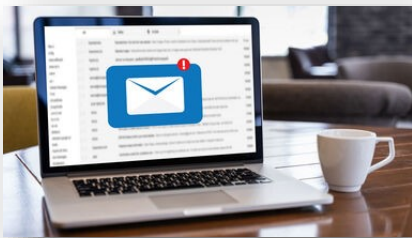

Legislative and Resolutions

This month, in the GFWC the Legislative Action Center under the "What We Do" tab, one of the many letters you can send with a click of a button is to urge Congress to pass the Family Violence Prevention and Services Improvement Act (FVPSA), providing core federal funding dedicated to resources and programs to combat intimate partner violence. The Family Violence Prevention and Services Improvement Act provides core, flexible funding for more than 1,500 local domestic violence shelters and programs so they can provide emergency shelter, crisis counseling, safety planning, legal assistance, intervention, domestic and dating violence prevention education, and other life-saving services annually to more than 1.3 million victims and their children.

The GFWC website has pre-printed letters addressed to our senators and our representative; all you have to do is hit "Submit" once you've added your name and address the first time. Here is a link to the page:

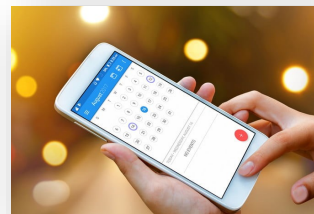
