Burlington County Light of Hope Marlton Woman's Club



Established in 1964 as the Marlton Society, the Marlton Woman's Club exemplifies community spirit. "The guiding principle of the group is to help others and make a difference," says June Adair, a member for 40 years. "We raise money and give it away." June especially enjoys the diversity of the club. "Our members are young and old, women from all walks of life who bring different ideas, cultures and awareness. It is amazing to see what women working together can do."

The club has been providing in-kind and monetary support to Providence House Domestic Violence Services in Burlington County for decades. Denna Gatti, a 10-year member, serves as the chair of the Domestic Violence Awareness and Prevention Committee. Donna said when she joined, she was made aware that supporting Providence House was a signature project for the group. Donna stars in regular contact with Community Outreach Coordinato Barb Katz to find out what things are needed on the safe house. "When there is a need and you're communicating the need, it's amazing how generous people are," said Donna.

Whether it's food, bedding, Halloween treats, Easter baskets, back-to-school gear or cleaning supplies, Providence House can count on a full van arriving from the Club. Recently, the Club has made celebrating Mother's Day at the safe house a priority. Members collect purses, cosmetics, jewelry and gift items for the women to remind them how special they are. When the club hosts Bingo games, participants receive a free bingo card if they bring an item from the Providence House wish first. Donna said people exchange not just one item, but hugs full of items for the free bingo card. 'It blows me away every single time,' she said. 'We're able to drop off vanloads of donstions after Bingo.''

Jane Fischer has been a member of the Club for three years. She is active in its Advocates for Children program and on its Legislation/Resolutions Committee which supports bills aiming to prevent domestic violence and those ensuring survivors' rights. Jane also volunteers as a member of Providence House's Domestic Violence Response Team. In this role, Jane is dispatched directly to the police station or hospital after an incident of domestic violence to provide support and advocate for the survivor. From this unique position, Jane can let the other members of the club know how powerful the impact of their donations to Providence House really are.

The Marlton Woman's Club consists of more than 50 members. The group is a part of the New Jersey State Federation of Women's Clubs and the General Federation of Women's Clubs. New members are always welcome.
