Honoring our Veterans: Veterans Day is November 11

Veterans Day (originally known as Armistice Day) is a <u>federal holiday in the United States</u> observed annually on November 11, for honoring <u>military veterans</u> of the <u>United States Armed Forces</u> (who were discharged under conditions other than dishonorable). It coincides with other holidays including <u>Armistice Day</u> and <u>Remembrance Day</u> which are commemorated in other countries that mark the anniversary of the end of World War I.

DID YOU KNOW? Major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 when the Armistice with Germany went into effect. At the urging of major U.S. veteran organizations, Armistice Day was renamed Veterans Day in 1954. Veterans Day commemorates the service of all U.S. veterans. Memorial Day in May honors those who have *died* while in military service.

Health and Wellness Awareness

Suicide is now the second leading cause of death among young people aged 15 to 24. In 2022, more than 49,000 people took their own lives, which is more than any other year on record. It is also a time to raise awareness about prevention. The National Suicide Prevention Lifeline is a hotline for individuals in crisis. The new Suicide and Crisis Lifeline is 988; if you know anyone who may be struggling with thoughts of suicide, please encourage them to use that hotline, or use it yourself to see how to help them.

Did you also know that September is **Better Breakfast Month**? This designation was first promoted by the Cereal Institute in 1951, to coincide with the start of school. A healthy breakfast is a great start to our day, at any age.


