Health and Wellness Awareness

What beautiful weather it's been to get out and exercise!! I read an article in the August 25th Philadelphia Inquirer (originally published in the Washington Post) headlined, "Yoga Might Protect Against Cognitive Decline." It is not definitive, but a randomized study of women over 50 who were already reporting some cognitive decline and were at increased risk of Alzheimer's did Kundalini yoga daily for 12 weeks, and later reported significantly less self-reported cognitive impairment than a similar group of women who did memory training instead of yoga. Apparently yoga protects our brains in 2 different ways – both through breathing to reduce stress reactivity and by helping brains more effectively use limited resources. So ladies – sign up for a yoga class! It has physical AND mental benefits.

September is National Suicide Prevention Month.

We all know how difficult it can be to stay healthy and positive in an increasingly difficult world. Please keep an eye on people you love and encourage them to share their thoughts and feelings with friends, family, faith leaders, or professional therapists if they appear "off." Promote awareness of groups like NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness) and of the suicide hotline 988. On the right panel of this article are two lists of suicide prevention warnings — one for adults and one for youth. Please familiarize yourself with these — you may save a life one day. Stay aware, stay active, and keep doing all the great things MWC does!


