


FALL BINGO

Women Leading the Fight for Climate Justice in the Face of Gendered Climate Impacts

There are endless examples of women-led sustainability movements and practices, as women, like our ecosystems, have been exploited, subjugated, and left to suffer the life-threatening impacts of the climate crisis at statistically higher rates.

As we survive in the [Anthropocene](#) – an epoch defined by humans' effect on the geologic record – it is difficult to ignore how the exploitation of ecosystems is deeply entwined with the subjugation of women. Climate collapse, mass extinction, and shallow ecological politics have rendered future ecosystems in tremendous danger, yet the climate emergency's impacts [are not felt equally](#).

The United Nations [estimates](#) 4 out of 5 people displaced by climate disasters are women and girls, with women and children estimated to be 14 times more likely to die than men due to disparities in the distribution of information and resources. These risks come not just from instances of extreme weather events but also long-term conditions that stem from climate and environmental changes, which – the National Institute of Health [notes](#) – can “negatively impact many stages of a woman’s reproductive life.” As these changes worsen pre-existing inequalities, marginalized women often face greater threats from resource insecurity and extreme weather, placing their safety and health at a statistically higher risk than men’s.

Joanne Lotierzo Memorial Scholarship



New Jersey Children's Alliance

Currently, NJCA (New Jersey Children's Alliance) is asking for all Southern district Woman's Clubs to reach out to your local representatives and assemblyperson to reinstate funding for the southern Regional Diagnostic and Treatment Center CARES Institute.

CARES Institute Regional Diagnostic and Treatment Center of South Jersey has had a major budget cut of \$2.7 million dollars. This cut caused 40% of their staff to be laid off and their Vineland office on the brink of being closed. This RDTC has been around for a couple of decades assisting in the medical and mental health assessment of those children who endured traumatic abuse and disclosed it to a trusted adult. The RDTC's are instrumental in the response and healing of children after disclosing such heinous acts against them. We are asking club members to send an email and contact their local representatives to support reinstating the funds to the medical treatment facility. Please share the information below with your club members, family, and friends. The state is in dire need of reinstatement of budgets throughout the medical, mental health, social service, and human service agencies.
