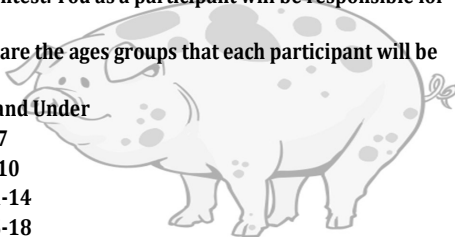

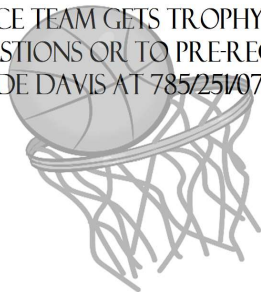

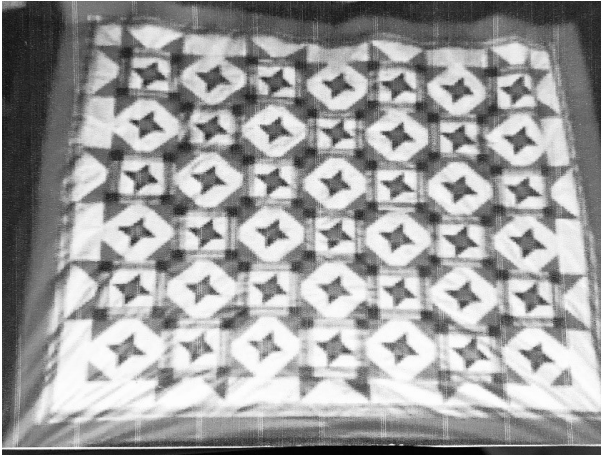

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Please obtain a numbered entry card at the Community Building. You must present the entry card as entries are taken to the judging area.

Please leave livestock and exhibits for others to enjoy. Entries may be picked up between 3:00 & 5:00 on Saturday. If the livestock has been taken before 3 pm on Saturday, you will forfeit your premiums. All grain and other farm products must be crop of 2018 unless otherwise stated on this premium sheet. No animals will be admitted to the fairgrounds if they are drugged or tranquilized and at any time during the Fair any suspect animal will be disqualified and sent home.

The Fair Board reserves the right to have a veterinarian determine if an animal has been drugged.

The Kansas Poultry Disease Act states that all poultry, except waterfowl, shown at Fairs must be certified to be free of pullorum-typhoid diseases.

All exhibitors will be expected to leave a clean stall at the end of the Fair.
