Our Programs

Drive Force/Volunteer-Assisted Rides

In 2019 our volunteers donated over **5,000 hours** and drove our clients over **31,000 miles** to destinations in every city district and County precinct.

Mobile Rides

Our ADA accessible vehicle enables us to give rides to clients when a volunteer is unavailable or when a quick turnaround is needed.



The Challenge

Older adults and people with disabilities who have limited access to affordable ride options, face isolation, a reduced quality of life, and possible economic hardship. A 2004 study found that adults age 65 and older who no longer drive make 15 percent fewer trips to the doctor, 59 percent fewer trips to shop or eat out, and 65 percent fewer trips to visit friends and family, than drivers of the same age.

The Solution

The solution involves everyone because older adults and individuals with disabilities need many types of transportation. Ride Connect Texas and organizations across the city are actively addressing these transportation challenges through Successfully Aging and Living in San Antonio (SALSA) and Connect SA.


