

Younger Learners (K-12)

English for Very Young Learners

The English for Very Young Learners course is a fun resource to be used with young learners between the ages of 4 and 6 with no previous knowledge of English.

The course centres around five endearing characters in a circus and covers high-frequency lexical areas for students of this age: names, numbers, colours, objects in a schoolbag, food, parts of the body, animals, family, clothes and party things.

Each of the course's 10 theme-based modules corresponds to approximately 20 minutes of play/study time and includes songs, animations, puppet videos and fun activities. The materials are designed to encourage young learners to use them again and again, as they become more familiar with the setting, characters, exercise types and language.

English for Kids

The two English for Kids courses are designed for children in the 8 to 12 age range, who have a basic knowledge of English (A1). Course A covers these topics: describing people, jobs and places of work, objects in a pencil case, pets, sport, family, household chores, the school day, free-time activities, and dinosaurs. Course B looks at the fol-

lowing lexical areas: types of transport; describing animals; telling the time and talking about daily routines; fairy tales; fast food; places in a town; endangered animals; days, months and birthdays; science-fiction stories; and diet and nutrition.

The material includes a variety of entertaining and stimulating activities – including stories, songs and games – and focuses on vocabulary extension and basic grammar practice. These courses are ideal as a complement to other class material, for self-study, and for children working together in pairs or small groups.

English for Teens – supplementary materials

The English for Teens supplementary materials are designed for learners between 12 and 14 years old who have a pre-intermediate knowledge of English (A2 to B1). The two courses, Course A and Course B, contain engaging, agerelevant interactive content, and are presented in a magazine-type format appealing to learners of this age, ideal for use in the classroom, for self-study, and for students working together in pairs or small groups.

For those candidates who want even more practice, Net Languages offers a further practice test which can be taken on its own, either before or after doing the preparation course. The practice test is self-marking in the listening and reading sections and tutor-graded in the writing and speaking sections.

In addition, in the practice test candidates receive detailed feedback on the two exam compositions, along with a live simulation of the speaking test itself and feedback on their performance.

English for Teens - course

The revolutionary English for Teens Course 1 and Course 2 are complete courses offering all the materials and activities needed for a whole academic year. Course 1 is designed for 13- to 14-year-old students, and Course 2 is designed for 14- to 15-year-olds. The courses contain a wide range of interactive materials and activities designed to be used in the classroom — with an interactive whiteboard and with or without individual computers; and they also fully integrate traditional classroom activities.

Each course contains nine topic-based units which are divided into eight clearly defined lessons, providing over 10 hours of active study time. Each unit includes five sub-topics, a wide variety of activities to do in the classroom, self-study activities, projects and tests.

The teacher's version of the course contains practical suggestions about how to use the material with a class, comprehensive teaching notes, and printable backup lessons.
