The Public Hearing for the adoption of the 2020 – 2021 budget of the Cedar County 911 Service Board was called to order at 8:15am on Tuesday, January 28, 2020 by Chair Warren Wethington. Those attending included Steve Agne, Cedar County Board of Supervisors; David Furry, Mayor of Mechanicsville; Roger Laughlin, Mayor of West Branch; Scott Spengler, Mayor of Durant (via phone); Tim Malott, Cedar County EMA. Others attending included Jodi Freet, Cedar County EMA/911; Sue Hall, Press.

Mayor Laughlin/West Branch made a motion to open the public hearing for the adoption of the budget; Motion seconded by Agne/Board of Supervisors. Motion carried.

Mayor Furry/Mechanicsville made a motion to approve the agenda; motion seconded by Mayor Laughlin, West Branch. Motion carried.

Chair Wethington read the purpose of the public hearing: The 911 Service Board of Cedar County is conducting a public hearing on the proposed fiscal year 2020 – 2021 budget. At this public hearing, any resident or taxpayer may present objections to, or arguments in favor of, any part of the proposed budget. This notice represents a summary of the supporting detail of receipts and expenditures on file with the 911 Service Board Secretary. Freet advised the Service Board that there were no objections on record.

Chair Wethington asked for questions on the budget. None were presented. Mayor Furry/Mechanicsville made a motion to adopt the budget; motion seconded by Mayor Laughlin, West Branch. Motion carried.
