The Public Hearing for the adoption of the FY 2025 – 2026 budget for the Cedar County Joint 911 Service Board was called to order at 8:15 am on Tuesday, January 21, 2025, by Sheriff Warren Wethington, 911 Service Board Chair. Those attending by teleconference included Michael Tharp, Stanwood City Council; Roger Laughlin, Mayor of West Branch. Those attending in person included Tammi Goerdts, Mayor of Tipton; Bruce Barnhart, Cedar County Board of Supervisors; Warren Wethington, Cedar County Sheriff; Jodi Freet, Director Cedar County EMA/911; Sue Hall, Press.

Mayor Goerdts/Tipton made a motion to approve the agenda; motion seconded by Barnhart/Board of Supervisors. Motion carried.


Sheriff Wethington read the purpose of the public hearing: The 911 Service Board of Cedar County is conducting a public hearing on the proposed fiscal year 2025 – 2026 budget. At this public hearing, any resident or taxpayer may present objections to, or arguments in favor of, any part of the proposed budget. This notice represents a summary of the supporting detail of receipts and expenditures on file with the 911 Service Board Secretary. Copies of the supplemental budget detail will be furnished upon request.

Director Freet advised the Service Board that there were no objections on record.

Sheriff Wethington asked for questions on the budget. None were presented. Sheriff Wethington requested a vote to adopt the proposed FY 2025-2026 budget. Motion made to adopt by Mayor Goerdts/Tipton; seconded by Barnhart/Board of Supervisors. Budget passed.

The motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Barnhart/Board of Supervisors; motion seconded by Mayor Goerdts/Tipton. Motion carried.
