The Public Hearing for the adoption of the FY 2026 – 2027 budget for the Cedar County Joint 911 Service Board was called to order at 8:15 am on Tuesday, February 3, 2026, by Sheriff Warren Wethington, 911 Service Board Chair. Those attending by teleconference included Roger Laughlin, Mayor of West Branch; Trent Siver, Mayor of Clarence; Tammi Goerdts, Mayor of Tipton; Orville Randolph, Durant Police Chief. Those attending in person included Jon Bell and Bruce Barnhart, Cedar County Board of Supervisors; Warren Wethington, Cedar County Sheriff; Thomas Daufeldt, Mayor of Durant; Dwayne Brown Jr, Director, Cedar County EMA/911; Mindy Beekman, Office Coordinator, Cedar County EMA/911; Sue Hall, Press.

Bell/Board of Supervisors made a motion to approve the agenda; motion seconded by Daufeldt/Mayor of Durant. Motion carried.

Sheriff Wethington read the purpose of the public hearing: The 911 Service Board of Cedar County is conducting a public hearing on the proposed fiscal year 2026 – 2027 budget. At this public hearing, any resident or taxpayer may present objections to, or arguments in favor of, any part of the proposed budget. This notice represents a summary of the supporting detail of receipts and expenditures on file with the 911 Service Board Secretary. Copies of the supplemental budget detail will be furnished upon request.

911 Office Coordinator advised the Service Board that there were no objections on record.

Sheriff Wethington asked for questions on the budget. None were presented. Sheriff Wethington requested a vote to adopt the proposed FY 2026-2027 budget. Motion made to adopt by Mayor Goerdts/Tipton; seconded by Mayor Daufeldt/Durant. Budget passed.

The motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Bell/Board of Supervisors; motion seconded by Mayor Daufeldt/Durant. Motion carried.
