

Zebra Mussels Found in Spring Lake in 2022




Earlier this year, there was of a "single" Zebra Mussel which was attached to a leaf stem during the initial lake survey on April 29. Zebra mussels are an Invasive Aquatic Species (AIS) and distinguished by a small striped, D-shaped shell composed of two hinged valves joined by a ligament. The shells are typically onequarter inch to one and one-half inches long, depending on age, with alternating yellow and brownish colored stripes. Adults are typically fingernail sized. Zebra mussels attach to hard surfaces underwater.

This Spring, the Spring Lake Association, with the assistance of Charlie Malecha, placed 15 Zebra Mussel Ladders around the lake to determine the degree of infestation. This was the repeat of a similar study that Charlie did back in 2020 which at that time showed no Zebra Mussels present.

Unfortunately, the results now show that the majority

sidered heavy. The attached map shows the locations of the ladders and the degree of infestation present. Based on communication received from April Londo, DNR AIS Specialist, "there is not much management that can be done once zebra mussels start reproducing. One can always track their population. Some populations reach a maximum capacity and will plummet in subsequent years, with ebbs and flows in abundance".

At this time we would suggest that boats, docks and lifts be monitored and cleaned upon removal. Procedures for cleaning equipment can be found on the DNR Website (Clean In Clean Out | Minnesota DNR (state.mn.us) Another suggestion is for boats and pontoons which are kept on lifts, their outboards and props be trimmed up to minimize the possibility of zebra mussels sticking to them.

2022 Eurasian Water Milfoil Update

As mentioned during the Annual Meeting, the Spring Lake Association was awarded a \$50,000 Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Grant to cover project costs in 2022 and 2023 for managing the Eurasian Water Milfoil (EWM) that was discovered during the summer of 2021.


To date, the Spring Lake Association and Blue Water Science have conducted three lake surveys resulting in treatments of 14 and 5 acres by Property and Land Management Corporation. Over the growing season of 2022, the two summer treatments have prevented heavy milfoil growth. The cost for the surveys and the treatment have totaled over \$25,000 and will be covered by the DNR Grant.

In working with Steve and Connor McComas from Blue Water Science on the latest survey conducted on September 9, they sampled over 100 sites with a rake sampler. Targeted sampling found EWM at 21 sites in 1 to 3 feet of water at pri-

marily light densities and moderate growth observed in 2 sites.

All of the observed EWM was in shallow water and believed will be impacted by the lake ice over winter. Also, they believe that autumn EWM growth generally does not predict the following summer EWM distribution or abundance. Steve suggested no further treatment this year but rather delineate the EWM next year and treat the moderate to heavy growth areas if found.

The SLA is fortunate to have established a close working relationship with Steve and Blue Water Science as his knowledge and history of Spring Lake is invaluable.



Spring Lake Ramp Improvement Completed on



The Spring Lake Association was successful in working with the DNR on obtaining the necessary permits to try and improve lake access by knocking down the mound and filling in the hole that had been created by boaters' power loading their boats back onto their trailers.

The final bill for the work completed by Klingberg Excavating and the purchase of a floating silt fence (now owned by the SLA) came to \$3,342. A huge thank you to the City of Prior Lake and the Spring Lake Township which split the cost of the bill as well to the Prior Lake Association in helping us navigate the permitting process. Additional thank you to Matt Batulis who organized the work with Joe Sullivan and Jeff Young from Klingberg Excavating as well as the SLA volunteers who helped install and remove the floating silt barrier. The SLA will continue to work with the DNR on some additional long term ramp improvement ideas.

Spring Lake Aquatic Plants 101

Steve McComas presented a seminar for Spring Lake residents on August 4. The SLA worked with the Prior Lake Spring Lake Watershed District who hosted the event at the City of Prior Lake City hall. The seminar covered topics such as the importance of aquatic plants on lake quality, the types of plants both native and invasive, management of plants and ways to improve lake quality. 25 people were present but another 57

Ten Years on Spring Lake | PLSLWD

Prior Lake Spring Lake Watershed District By **Shauna Capron**, *Water Resources Technician*

Spring Lake has experienced a lot of changes over the last decade, the most noticeable is overall improvement of the lake's appearance and water quality.

Back in 2012, the lake was visibly green from an abundance of algae in the water, and it experienced frequent algal blooms. Chlorophyll-a, which is responsible for the green color of the lake during times of high algae content, had a seasonal average of 68.5 μ g/L, which is over three times the MPCA-set chlorophyll-a standard (20 μ g/L) for Spring Lake! Algal blooms are fueled by excess nutrients in the water, primarily phosphorus. In 2012 the seasonal total phosphorus average measured at 109 μ g/L, nearly double the standard (60 μ g/L).

With the support of residents and state funding, PLSLWD decided that an alum treatment was needed to turn the lake around. Alum treatments help remove phosphorus from the water column, which reduces algae and helps increase water clarity. Spring Lake has received three alum treatments in the last ten years. While alum can be effective on its own, it is made more effective for a longer period of time when it is paired with additional phosphorus-reduction efforts, such as the removal of common carp.

Around this same time in 2012, common carp were found to be a significant problem in Spring Lake - Carp uproot native aquatic plants and stir up the lake sediment as they feed on the bottom of the lake. The uprooting of aquatic plants increases phosphorus, which fuels algal blooms and decreases the oxygen content in the water. This is harmful to native aquatic plant species and detrimental to water quality.


Carp are considered a significant threat to water quality at populations of 100 kg/ha and above. The carp population in Spring Lake has fluctuated over time, but in 2018 it was estimated to be approximately 266 kg/ha. As of mid-2022, that population has been reduced to approximately 227 kg/ha. This reduction was achieved through a holistic approach to carp management, including not just removals of carp directly from the lake itself, but also strategically placing barriers throughout the District to cut carp off from their spawning locations. Carp removal in Spring Lake continues to be a priority for the District heading into 2023.

Spring Lake also benefits from projects located in the area that drains to Spring Lake, referred to as the "upper watershed," such as the District's Ferric Chloride facility. This facility helps to reduce the phosphorus load coming into Spring Lake from external sources, such as roads, development, and croplands, and it also acts as a barrier against spawning carp! As the District continues to make progress on projects in the upper watershed, the levels of phosphorus coming into Spring Lake will continue to decrease over time.

Reducing phosphorus and chlorophyll-a in Spring Lake has improved water clarity, which allows sunlight to reach deeper into the water column and supports more aquatic plants to grow! Although aquatic plants are often seen as a nuisance, they play a critical role in helping maintain good water quality and clarity by absorbing phosphorus, providing food and shelter for fish and wildlife, infusing oxygen into the water, and stabilizing shorelines.

This combination over the years of alum treatments, carp management, upper watershed phosphorus reduction, and increased plant life has led to a substantial increase in Spring Lake's water quality. As can be seen in the figure below, Spring Lake has met phosphorus and water clarity standards for the last two years.

The work on Spring Lake is far from over, but it is encouraging to see that the efforts of the District and SLA have had an impact. PLSLWD staff looks forward to continuing water quality improvement initiatives on Spring Lake in 2023.




