

MONTGOMERY PILGRIMAGE FOR ALL AGES



Tuesday-Friday, October 6-9, 2026



Join us to experience:

- **The Legacy Museum**, recounting the history of racial injustice throughout this nation's history;
- **The National Memorial for Peace and Justice**, honoring all known victims of lynching in the United States;
- **Freedom Monument Sculpture Park**, featuring a boat ride down the Alabama River to a 17 acre park with outdoor art that culminates with an enormous monument to the 4.7 million newly freed persons of color listed in the 1870 U.S. Census.
- **Montgomery Square**, the newest Legacy Site, where we will learn about the Civil Rights movement in Montgomery during the decade of 1955-1965;
- **Time for Prayer, Reflection, and Debriefing**, during which we will discuss all that we experience, striving to listen to how our deepest faith commitments help orient us toward justice and the common good.

Day 1 (Tuesday, October 6)

Arrive in Montgomery and check in at the SpringHill Suites by Marriott Montgomery Downtown (152 Coosa Street, Montgomery, AL 36104). We will gather for supper, which will include an orientation to our time together.

Day 2 (Wednesday, October 7)

After eating complimentary breakfast in the hotel and having a brief time of centering and prayer, we will begin our day traveling by boat up the Alabama River to the Freedom Monument Sculpture Park, a 17 acre park where art installations and historic structures intermingle with nature along the river's edge.

Afterwards, we will travel the few minutes back downtown to the Legacy Museum and have lunch in the museum at Pannie-George's Kitchen before touring the museum in the afternoon.



If families determine the content of the museum may be too intense for their children, alternate activities will be provided for these children so that their adults can still visit the museum.

After supper, adults and older children can gather for an hour-long time

of prayer, reflection, and debriefing.

Special Note for Families:



Ashley will provide scavenger hunts, notebooks and coloring pencils, and other activities to help younger participants engage with what they are seeing, and as mentioned above, an alternate activity will be provided if parents do not think their children are ready to encounter some of the more intense images and experiences in the Legacy Museum.

Day 3 (Thursday, October 8)



On day three, after breakfast and centering prayer in the hotel, we will visit both the National Memorial for Peace and Justice, which memorializes our nation's lynching victims, and the newly opened Montgomery Square, that tells the civil rights story of Montgomery in the decade from 1955-1965. Then, we will walk across the street for lunch at AYA Soulful Dining inside the Elevation Convening Center and Hotel.

After lunch, participants can choose how to spend the afternoon and early evening, including exploring the hotel's library that includes exhibits found elsewhere in the Legacy Sites, an afternoon visit to neighboring Selma, rest, or other Montgomery area activities.

Our day will conclude with a post-dinner gathering for prayer,

reflection, and debriefing.

Day 4 (Friday, October 9)

We will conclude our time together with a worship service that will provide time for group reflection and exploring what we wish to take with us from this pilgrimage, including how we might differently enact our faith. You may join us for lunch back at Pannie-George's Kitchen before departing.

Cost Details

Cost for Pilgrimage: \$100 for one person, with a maximum of \$250 per family

Hotel Cost: \$525 (Payable to the hotel at check-in)

Cost Includes: 3 nights at the SpringHill Suites by Marriott Montgomery Downtown (includes breakfast), Tickets to all museums and sites, Optional alternate activity(ies) for younger children during Legacy Museum visit, Daily group gatherings for prayer, reflection, and debriefing led by experienced ministers and pilgrimage leaders

Does Not Include: Lunches/Dinners, Transportation to Montgomery
