#### **WEEKLY WORSHIP SERVICES**



## VISION OF HOPE by Pastor Hill "Hope Restored?"

We keep hearing the expression "New Normal" as though it describes a better way of being for us all, but I'm among the many who yearn for the "Same old normal" way of life that has been fading from our memories as this terrible Covid pandemic wears on.

As the number of people who receive the vaccine increases and the number of people who have had the disease and have recovered grows, there is more hope that the day will come when we will be able to live mask-free and give hugs and handshakes with abandon.

Sadly for many, because of the losses we have had (loved ones and jobs for some), there will be no "normal" at all.

The season of Lent, which in past years we have often not thought very much about, may turn out to be the beginning of God's way of restoring hope for us all this year, and it can't come soon enough.

# PARISH CENSUS PLANNED

# LENTEN SERVICES "PLACES of the PASSION"



Plans are being made for an exciting and enriching Lenten season this year beginning with **Ash Wednesday**, February 17. Each Wednesday we will have two services, at noon and at 7 p.m., They will be in person and on Zoom.

The traditional imposition of ashes on Wednesday will be different this year because of the pandemic. Those who attend services will have the ashes applied with an applicator, and those who remain at home can get individual

packets of ashes from the church before Ash Wednesday to use as part of the online services.

"Places of the Passion" is the theme of our weekly services during Lent. Each Wednesday at noon and 7 p.m. we will focus on one of the key places in the story of the passion of our Lord.

The places where the passion of our Lord took place hold special meaning to Christians the world over. These places remind us that Jesus walked this earth and stood in locations we can still find today to carry out his mission of salvation. This was no sightseeing trip for our Savior. There was a serious reason he came to be at certain places and at particular times to suffer and die and rise again. He was fulfilling the will of his Father who desired that we be forgiven and given a place in heaven with him forever.

The services will include photos of the places we will "visit," and to support the Lenten journey, we will have devotional booklets based on the Lenten theme.


#### ANCHOR NURSERY SCHOOL RE-OPENED
