MOVING AHEAD INTO THE SUMMER

This year’s Annual Meeting was held on Sunday, May 19, with nearly 60 members attending. We reviewed the Pastor’s Report, approved a budget beginning July 1, and elected five new council members: Melissa Itara, Michael Johnson, Tom Reeve, Sue Soper, and Andy Steck. Phil Millwater was elected to serve a full term as well.

One of the main focal points for the coming year as Hope will be the task of building community. We have a diverse congregation that is divided also by the fact that we worship at four separate times during the non-summer months. A special effort is needed to improve our communications and develop deeper relationships among our members. We will be working on this as part of a special Stewardship emphasis this fall.

PARISH SECRETARY POSITION

Because our Parish Secretary Barbara Nugent is retiring on June 30th, we are reviewing the work of the Parish Secretary. We would like to hire someone who could be trained in June, before she leaves her post. Computer skills are required, of course, and the church office hours are on Monday-Thursday, from 9 a.m.-2:30 p.m.

OUR NEW BISHOP

On May 17th, our Synod Assembly elected Pastor Paul Egensteiner to serve as the bishop of the Metro NY Synod for a six-year term. He is now serving as the pastor of Emanuel Lutheran Church in Pleasantville, NY. He is a graduate of Wagner College and the Lutheran School of Theology in Chicago. He formerly served Immanuel Lutheran Church in Staten Island.

Bishop Egensteiner will assume his office this August and will be installed at the Cathedral of Saint John the Divine on November 18th.

INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Earlier this year we voted to accept an intern who will serve for a whole year beginning this fall. Internship in a local congregation is a requirement for every person preparing to become an ordained pastor in the church. See the “*Vision of Hope*” article on page two for more details.

One of the benefits of having an intern this year is that it will give us a year to work on building up our membership and stewardship so we can be in a better situation when we attempt to call a pastor to serve as an Associate Pastor who could enable us to have a more positive transition when our current pastor retires from active ministry.

This intern is not a “candidate” for such a role, but having an intern will give us a better idea of what another pastor can bring to our ministry.



VISION OF HOPE A NEW VICAR

One of the important parts of the process of preparing people to serve as pastors in the church is having them serve a full year working in a parish as a vicar. Over the past 30 years Hope has been blessed by having four interns, all of whom became pastors.

This September we will welcome another vicar, Eric Faret, who has completed two years of study at our United Lutheran Seminary. A member of Ascension Lutheran Church, Vicar Eric lives in Deer Park with his wife Lisa. He retired after 35 years working for Nabisco and responded to God's call to prepare to serve as a pastor. He brings a level of experience in sales management that will be helpful in carrying out our mission here, but he will be involved in the full gamut of activities that are part of the everyday work of a pastor: leading worship services and preaching, teaching children, youth, and adults, and visiting the homebound, the sick and the hospitalized as well.

Vicars are not ordained ministers. They are simply

"pastors-in-training," so they do not consecrate at the altar or perform weddings. They can assist or even lead funeral services., and they attend meetings.

Eric is a trained Stephen Leader, so he will serve on our Stephen Ministry Leadership Team, and he will provide pastoral care and support as needed.

We are forming a Support Team that will meet each month to review his work and provide some feedback as part of his learning process. If you have a special interest in serving on this, please share that with our Council President, Carol Bottstein or Pastor.

Interns receive a stipend from the congregation, so we will be asking members to give to the Internship Fund beginning in June.

His internship begins on September 1, and we will have an induction ceremony as part of the 9:30 a.m. service on our "Welcome Sunday," September 8th. Please keep him in your prayers as he begins this very important part of his learning process.
