#### THE GOSPEL OF GRACE



## THE PASTOR'S CORNER

### "Freedom for What?"

"Freedom" is a word that the Apostle Paul uses in today's lesson from Galatians chapter 5. It is also a word we hear often in public discourse in America in a totally different context, so it is very helpful for us to explain what we mean when we are using the term.

First century Jews who became followers of Jesus experienced freedom as liberation from the strict requirements of the Law of Moses, a way of life that controlled virtually every aspect of their everyday lives and separated them from relationships with people who were not descendants of Abraham and Sarah. The freedom they experienced through faith in Jesus made it possible for them to live in harmony with the will of God and in community with others, including Gentiles.

For Gentiles who became followers of Jesus, the gift of freedom changed their whole outlook on life and set them free from the "works of the flesh," fornication, uncleanness, licentiousness, Idolatry, sorcery, hostilities, strife, jealousy, bursts of rage, selfish ambition, factiousness, divisions, moods of envy, drunkenness, wild partying, and the like. Through their baptism they were now able to live as children of God, empowered by the indwelling Spirit of God and bearing the "fruit of the Spirit," a life of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self control.

In simple terms, in Christ, both Jews and Gentiles alike were set free to live their lives as God intended them to live, in harmony with God, God's creation, and their neighbors.

That same freedom is God's gift to us as well today. We've been set free to love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength, and to love our neighbors as ourselves. What a gift God has given!

#### **EXPLORE OUR LUTHERAN ROOTS**

Beginning in September we will have an opportunity to explore our Lutheran heritage and discover what makes Martin Luther's message revolutionary today!

Justified by faith. We are accustomed to this theology today, but when Martin Luther shared his belief in this concept during the 16th century, it was anything but typical—it sparked the Reformation. Author Rob Fuquay says that although "justified by faith" is not a new idea. Luther's message is as revolutionary today as ever.

In *A New Reformation*, Fuquay helps you take a close look into the life of Martin Luther and teaches you how to embrace the spirit of the reformation in our church and in your life today.

Beginning the week of September 18, we will have study groups for members and new members of Hope to explore this theme. His book and the DVD (with segments filmed in Prague, Dresden, Leipzig, Wittenberg, Erfurt, Eisleben, Worms, and Mainz), will provide us with a resource for at least a sixweek group study.

This course of study is perfect for Christians at all stages of their spiritual journey. Plan now to take part in this exciting exploration of the life and work of the Reformer and its effects our lives and our world today!
