2025 Champions for Children Honorees:

- Community Champion: Feed Fannin "One Community, One Spirit"
 - This volunteer-driven organization committed to providing food assistance and promoting self-sufficiency in Fannin County was instrumental in the early days of Snack in a Backpack and has supported local food initiatives for over 15 years. Feed Fannin is an essential partner to the Snack in a Backpack Summer Meals program. In Summer 2024 alone, Feed Fannin provided a massive 5,317 pounds of fresh produce to families with children during the eight weeks of summer school break.
- Media Champion: The News Observer & Glenn Harbison
 - The News Observer, with publisher and editor Glenn Harbinson at the helm, has been a vital source of information for Fannin County and the Copper Basin area. Week after week, Glenn elevates awareness of community causes, regularly highlighting organizations working to improve children's lives. Glenn's concern for those in need can be observed each week through his heartfelt reporting. The News Observer team proactively monitors and reports on how the Snack in a Backpack program progresses throughout the year connecting the organization with the community at critical moments when support is needed.
- Children's Champion (In Memoriam): A.D. Frazier, Jr.
 - A.D. Frazier was a generous benefactor in the North Georgia community serving on the board of Fannin County Family Connection and contributing to Toys for Tots, Feed Fannin and Snack in a Backpack, programs all dedicated to supporting children in need. Loyal contributions to Snack in a Backpack from A.D. and his wife Sha over the years helped ensure that many Fannin children in need did not go hungry.
