### Other Children We Have Helped In The Past

**Shamika Ali** was in need of a corneal transplant surgery on her left eve and CFTT provided monetary assistance to pay for the surgery in Trinidad that was succesful.

Adam Samaroo of Chaguanas, 3 years old, was diagnosed with ventricular septal defect (a hole in the heart) and was taking less than half his prescribed formula. At 8 months old, Dr. Alexander of Mount Hope Hospital referred him to Jacksonville Hospital in Miami for corrective surgery that allowed Adam to return to a normal life. CFTT pledged \$3,000 to assist in covering the cost.

Kareem Aimes needed an auto-conjunctival transplant on his blind left eye. He traveled to and stayed at The Ronald McDonald House in Los Angeles. He was operated at the Hollywood Hospital by Dr. Jonathan Song, both of whom volunteered their services. Expenses were paid by CFTT and the Government of Trinidad and Tobago.

Simone Ragonath of Piarco, was born with several defects. She had no anal passage and a hole in her heart. CFTT and The Gift of Life Foundation funded her medical attention and successful surgery at the Schneider's Children Hospital in Hyde Park, New York.






# COREEN FIELDS ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD Monique Tillis





I joined the neighborhood watch club, and by 1988 became the block captain after serving for four (4) years.


In 1989 became a volunteer with the Inglewood Police Department Juvenile Unit, as a curfew coordinator for two years, until a new Chief of Police was elected, and the program was discontinued.

Started working at Federal Express in 1999, but still felt the need to give back to the community; I started feeding the homeless with my income. The first time I feed the homeless; I prepared 40 dinners, and realized this was not enough, and this has to continue, my charity "Give Thanks Feeding" was formed: to date I have made 121 dinners, 65 soups, numerous cups of coffee for the homeless. Over the years I have received donations and other help from my family, close friends and members of Citizens & Friends of Trinidad & Tobago. In 2011 one of my sisters in Trinidad and Tobago called me enlisting my help to open a Sunday Bible School in her area for kids ages 4-12. I helped my sister with her request; in addition, I also sent her story books, coloring books, crayons, water colors, pens, pencils and much more. This way the kids can have fun while learning about our Lord and Savior.

I also have a neighborhood Christmas party every year for the kids, where they play games, get their faces painted, eat and each child goes home with a gift. Last year I was able to provide a bouncy castle to add to the fun and excitement.

Years ago at the Rialto theatre in Jamaica West Indies, Jeff saw his first movie, titled One Potato, Two Potato, the story of a white family in crisis, held together by the nanny of the children, a woman who happened to be African American. He admired the talent, class and

sophistication of the woman portraying this character, and turned to his mom and said.

"That's what I want to do when I grow up, be an actor, and be as good as that woman".

Years later he auditioned for the Urban Arts Corps who was casting for their current production of "Play Mas" by Mustapha Matura from Trinidad, the role was a dancing witch doctor in a grass skirt and he should be a west Indian, who can sing, dance, and act. He landed the role and was on his way to pursue his dream under the guidance of the artistic director of the UAC. Four Broadway shows and countless regional shows later, he realized that his mentor and director of the Urban Arts Corps was the same actress he saw years earlier in the movie "One Potato Two Potato" Ms. Vinette Carroll, the first African American woman, director and producer on Broadway. He's since done many movies for the screen. "Predator II" "Marked For Death" "Don't Be A Menace" "Only the Strong" to name a few, and numerous guest spots for television including series lead roles in "Hudson Street" for ABC and "Union Square" for NBC, prime time shows and daytime soap operas, and other series lead roles for the major television networks. A director of numerous productions on, and off Broadway. He recently directed and premiered "Speak Of Me As I Am", the story of Paul Robeson, with K.B. Solomon for the North Carolina Black Theatre Festival to rave reviews, the show is now touring. He was Associate Producer for, and performed in, the "Black Stars Of The Great White Way" event, at the prestigious Carnegie Hall, NY, in June of 2014. # CFTT COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD Gregorio "Damien" Garcia

I was born in the town of Arima in Trinidad and Tobago in the West Indies. I grew up in the country with my grandparents, in my teenage years I lived with my aunt in San Juan while being employed by Bermudez Company.

I later obtained a job with Charlo's catering which catered to the employees of BWIA which is now known as Caribbean Airlines. During that time I got married, my wife and I migrated to New York in the United States in the early 80's and had our daughter Charisse. We then relocated to New Jersey where our son Damien was born.

I was offered a job in California, so I made my way out West. I worked for a few companies and lived in different cities before settling in the Bellflower area then become self employed. I was also the proud owner of a West Indian restaurant in Inglewood Ca, known as Caricom. I joined the Islander's Soccer Team becoming one of the teams most improved players.

My home in Bellflower eventually became the "Trini's in Southern California" liming (hang out) spot and the location for numerous fundraising events, such as parties, all fours card games also breakfast and lunch cook out. At one of our regular fundraising activities the group "Regulars' Entertainment" was formed which led to the birth of our now world famous "Hollywood Carnival" of which I am one of the founding members.

I attend events of all the Caribbean groups and organizations in the Los Angeles area and generously contribute to Citizens & Friends of Trinidad & Tobago. My goal and desire is to unite all the Caribbean people in Southern California.



### CFTT OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT AWARD (GUEST OF HONOR)

April Sutton is an award-winning Television Broadcast Pioneer in Hollywood. She made history becoming the youngest Inductee in the Broadcasters Hall of Fame in 1993 for her outstanding television reports on Black Entertainment Television (B.E.T.) Network.

More than 40 million TV viewers have watched her entertainment reports covering the Oscar Awards, Grammy Music Awards, Emmy Awards, Golden Globe Awards, American Music Awards, Hollywood Movie Premieres, and Red-Carpet gala events.

The Ohio native became the first hired Hollywood on-air talent for B.E.T., as the "Face of Hollywood" for 10 years, which sealed her name as part of BET's early history.

Her list of celebrity interviews includes: Oscar winners Jamie Foxx, Jennifer Hudson, Denzel Washington, Halle Berry, Tom Hanks, and top artists Jim Carey, Tom Cruise, Beyonce, Janet Jackson, Quincy Jones, Sean Connery, Chris Rock, Jessica Alba, Jennifer Lopez, Mariah Carey, Madonna, Samuel L. Jackson, Robin Williams, P. Diddy, Eddie Murphy and Michael Jackson just to name a few.

Her status as a Hollywood Socialite and popular TV Host soon opened new career opportunities. In 1996 she became a contributing West Coast Television Correspondent for the Geraldo Show (CBS), covering the O.J. Simpson case, the Princess Diana story, the Ennis Cosby story, the Tupac Shakur story, Hollywood movie premieres and Redcarpet gala events.

Ms. Sutton has received many honors for her television work in Hollywood as the Producer and Host of the "April in Hollywood" Show, which has aired on the Time Warner Cable Television Channel. Additionally, the City of Los Angeles presented special proclamations to her, along with the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, City of Compton, City of Lynwood, and top recognitions from many civic and community organizations.

In addition to her many achievements, Ms. Sutton is a committed advocate of Tanzania. She has sent countless numbers of boxes of brand new tennis shoes to children in Tanzania, and has worked tirelessly,

developing projects which bridges the gap between top celebrities and Tanzania.

Last year, she produced a video titled: "Hollywood to Tanzania" featuring celebrities giving greetings to the people of Tanzania. Her cultural and artistic campaigns have also successfully attracted entertainers who have written messages to the citizens of Tanzania, which was given to the country for a special museum exhibit. This year, her work continues as the Founder of the Diversi-Tea Celebration. The evening gala recognizes Union Day in Hollywood.

She has observed the United Nations General Assembly, where World Leaders including Presidents, Kings, Prime Ministers, and Foreign Ministers speak in front of an international audience about global issues. Her attendance at international summits, and leadership forums, keeps her current on topics discussed by participating Diplomats.

Ms. Sutton lights up when she talks about the road that has brought her to this plateau. Her unwavering focus on inter-cultural affairs and her extensive association with world renown celebrities seems to be a tailored made match for the next phase.

She will always be known as the first hired Hollywood based Television Personality on the first Black Television Network in American history, but she remains clear on the importance of her global efforts.

She states, "I am certainly linked to B.E.T. and the public never hesitates to remind me that I had a major role as the first "Face of Hollywood" for the network, but my television career also gave me a broad range of international interests." She adds, "I felt compelled to develop artistic, cultural, and media initiatives for Africa, which have been successful because of the willingness of celebrities and community supporters, who like myself, see the importance of connecting with global citizens."

Currently residing in Los Angeles, Ms. Sutton is single, and conducts workshops for youth and college students across the country. She holds a Masters Degree in Television Communications from Kent State University, and a B.A. Degree in Speech Communications.
