



STEW OXTAIL II RECIPE

- 1 lb oxtail, seasoned and marinated
- 4 potatoes, peeled, cubed
- 2 tbsp oil
- 2 tbsp sugar
- salt to taste
- water

- Season and marinated the oxtail for about an hour.
 Heat the oil and add the sugar over a medium flame.
 When the sugar has a golden colour, add the oxtail and stir. Make sure the oxtail gets evenly coated with the caramelized sugar.
- 4) Allow the oxtail to cook in its own juices for approximately 5 minutes.
- 5) Add water to cover the meat and pressure cook for about 15 minutes.

(As you can see most of the water has evaporated and the oxtail is half done after the 15 minutes.) 6) Now its time to add the potatoes.

- 7) Add enough water again and pressure cook until the oxtail is tender
- 8) The finished stew oxtail with potato. Serve with rice, beans, and fried plantains.



and Arnold O. Beckman; Professor of Chemistry.

In 2017 she participated in the Ruth and Eugene Roberts internship at the City of Hope Beckman Research Institute, an "inquiry-based biomedical research program for undergraduate and advanced high school students"; she worked under Dr. Samanta Pal, Assistant Clinical Professor; Dr. Rick Kittles, Professor and Director. The main study aimed to illuminate the multifactorial genetic and prostate cancer risk factors affecting African-ancestry men. In 2018 Kemi was again selected in the Ruth and Eugene Roberts internship at the City of Hope Beckman Research Institute, this internship allowed her to deepen and extend her research that will result in two manuscripts for publication in the scien-tific journal.

Her reggae career as a concert promoter and production expands over 30 years.... Her career in radio spans over 20 years. She started in radio at KCRW answering phones and providing a cultural reggae entertainment calendar for 5 years on Roger Steffens Reggae Show. After which she landed her own Reggae Radio Show at KFOX FM "Vibes So Nice" until the station was sold to a Christian station.

The next month she started at KKBT FM for ten years hosting the "Get Up Stand Up show, and became a member of AFTRA/SAG Union.

Her career as a concert promoter for REGGAE began when Bob Marley passed in 1981 and she helped plan a memorial gathering in Mac Arthur Park for the public, with local bands and speakers. Thousands of fans turned out and she was inspired to continue the celebration of his life the following year on his birthday, February 6th. known as "The Bob Marley Days"/Ragga Muffin Festival. This celebration became an annual event for the next 30 years. The celebration started on the grounds of The Federal Building in Westwood and ended 30 years later at the Long Beach Convention Center with 30,000 fans in attendance.

In February of 2004 Bob Marley received a Star on the Hollywood Boulevard Walk of Fame and she was the petitioner for his star and worked on it for 10 years gathered signatures at all concerts.

She hosted numerous events at the Roxy and Hollywood Bowl and interviewed artist from around the world and promoted their music. She organized and hosted Promoters Workshops and Cultural Bus Tours in the Los Angeles community.

She was committed and dedicated to introducing Reggae musicians to California. Here is a list of some of the greatest Reggae Artist to travel and be heard on radio and promoted in live concerts along with famous bands from Jamaica.

She was in a position to gross the financial barriers FREE of cost and music was promoted far across the waters introducing Soca and Calypso to a vast majority of listeners.

She has been very influential in bringing 3rd World Music to Los Angeles, and bridged the disconnected to the other side of the world. The Music and the rich culture from the Caribbean were loved and embraced in California. This motivated many to travel the Islands of the Caribbean. She has received many awards and recognitions here and abroad. She strongly believes that music is our soundtrack to life and history. There are so many artists that have become the voice of civil rights and awareness and their musical exposure is healing and profound.

Shamika Ali was in need of a corneal transplant surgery on her left eye and CFTT provided monetary assistance to pay for the surgery in Trinidad that was succesful.

Adam Samaroo of Chaguanas, 3 years old, was diagnosed with ventricular septal defect (a hole in the heart) and was taking less than half his prescribed formula. At 8 months old, Dr. Alexander of Mount Hope Hospital referred him to Jacksonville Hospital in Miami for corrective surgery that allowed Adam to return to a normal life. CFTT pledged \$3,000 to assist in covering the cost.

Kareem Aimes needed an auto-conjunctival transplant on his blind left eye. He traveled to and stayed at The Ronald McDonald House in Los Angeles. He was operated at the Hollywood Hospital by Dr. Jonathan Song, both of whom volunteered their services. Expenses were paid by CFTT and the Government of Trinidad and Tobago.

Simone Ragonath of Piarco, was born with several defects. She had no anal passage and a hole in her heart. CFTT and The Gift of Life Foundation funded her medical attention and successful surgery at the Schneider's Children Hospital in Hyde Park, New York.

Miss Richards is a 20 year old student who was born and grew up in Bank Village, Carapichaima, Trinidad and Tobago. She attended Carapichaima East Secondary School from which she graduated in 2015 with Honors in Math, Physics, Biology, and English. She is now enrolled in The School of Medicine at University of Montemorelos in Mexico.

In May 2018 she was diagnosed with Keratoconus. This is a progressive eye disease in which the normally rounded cornea of the eye bulges into a cone-like shape. This bulging causes distortion of the light on its way to the retina, thus causing distorted vision. In June 2018 she had a surgical procedure on her left eye (known as Cornea Crosslinking procedure) which was guite successful. Meanwhile she has lost vision in her right eye. The condition of her right cornea has deteriorated to such an extent that she now needs a corneal transplant in order to be able to see again out of that eye.

The estimated cost of the procedure and medical follow-up is US \$10,000.00 of which she has already raised about \$1000.00. The loss of vision in her right eye will have a severely negative impact on her chosen profession as a Medical Doctor.
