- --steep learning curve required in addition to academic learning


## Student Growth

--students were challenged to be available for learning, even while managing social emotional struggles related to quarantines.

--students were challenged to manage family dynamics to create learning spaces within the home

--students were challenged to learn with minimal peer interaction and discussion opportunities

## Technology—

- Many students and tutors gained new learning tools that can be used in addition to face to face techniques
- Students and tutors found ways to connect and work together – using ipads, cellphones, whatever worked!

 \* In collaboration with teachers, EVTA developed online workgroups to give students as much peer interaction as possible when engaging in learning activities.

### Student Growth

\*Although complete data was not available from all schools, about 65% of students at Anansi Charter School achieved academic goals in reading and/or math

\*Tutors devoted significant time to mentoring students through social emotional hurdles and through executive function skills development. EVTA tutors logged 585.5 mentoring hours in 2020-2021 school year.



Opportunities created through the COVID 19 Pandemic EVTA Tutors and students learned a great deal about on-line collaboration and learning.

- Zoom meetings and online learning platforms can now be used to 1. maintain tutoring schedules even when tutor or student is out of town.
- Make materials available to tutors and students anytime/anywhere
- Provide fun and easy opportunities for students to demonstrate their learning: for example Jamboard, Flipgrid
- Include students or parents who are unable to attend a group work session Or hold meetings/sharing sessions for tutors living in different communities



- As a result of the pandemic...
- EVTA sees the essential role that mentorship plays in a successful tutoring relationship, and will continue to seek funders who will support the additional hours necessary to provide this guidance to students. EVTA has scheduled several trainings in mentorship for tutors in August 2021.
- EVTA realizes the importance of advocacy for students—
- 1. as a skill to be taught to students to teach them to self advocate
- 2. as a role that tutors assume within a school site to help students access the resources they need to succeed.
- 3. as a role for the organization as a whole to assist in advocating for systemic change
- And is seeking training for tutors/board members in this area.

# Enrichment during the Pandemic

EVTA collaborates with Embudo Valley Library in Dixon, NM to provide a 4 day per week enrichment learning afterschool program. Unfortunately the face to face portion of this program was shuttered after the summer of 2020 and the program was delivered through Grab n Go bags. Plans to reopen the face to face program are slated for September 2021.

- this includes tech training and mentorship training





#### **Results from Student Survey**:

83% agreed that the tutor helped him/her understand the classwork 83% agreed that s/he enjoyed learning with his/her tutor

74% agreed that the tutor helped him/her stay organized and helped them turn in work

80% agreed that the tutor helped him/her learn skills that would help him/her advance to the next grade


**Results from Parent Survey**: 100% felt that EVTA helped the child cope with remote learning


