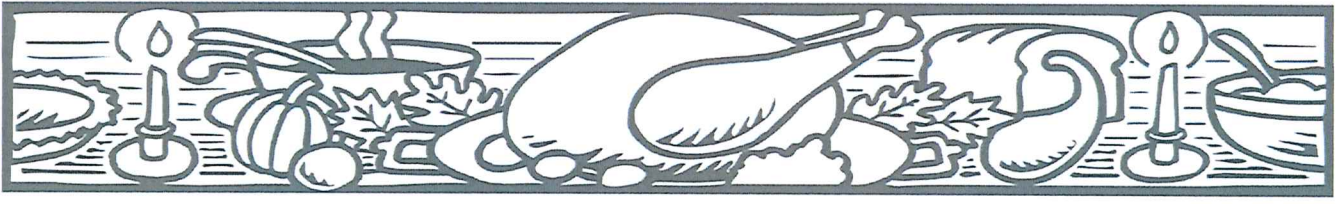

Read the slip thoroughly and be sure your child understands the way Homework Lab will work and can meet the expectations. A calendar is attached to this packet for December and January. Students may attend Homework Lab as often as needed.

***Please note: This is an offering for after school help in a group setting, it is not individual/one-on-one tutoring. This time period requires a combination of independence and positive behavior choices to make the time beneficial. Please consider these things when choosing to attend Homework Lab. Homework Lab is not after school day care. Extended Day is still available for those that need it and are signed up with the Extended Day program.

Homework Lab Permission Slip 2021-2022

I, _____, give my permission for my child, _____ in grade _____ to stay after school in the homework room on Tuesdays and/or Thursdays during the 2021-2022 school year. I understand the homework room is a place where students will self-guide themselves through their assigned tasks, but will be able to ask a teacher for guidance on areas they are struggling with or at times they are unsure of their work/answers. A teacher will be available to help small groups with questions or topics as well. I understand each child is expected to do his/her best to keep behaviors and conversations on the task at hand. I also understand that my child should be picked up at door D at the end of homework lab OR my child can have prior arrangements to attend the Extended Day program after tutoring (meaning the child is already registered as a regular participant in Extended Day care).

Behavior: All students are expected to conduct themselves as they would in a classroom setting. Students with excessive disturbances or misconduct will be issued a warning. If the misconduct continues, the child will be dismissed from homework lab for the remainder of the quarter or amount of time designated by administration.

All students not picked up at the designated dismissal time for their grade level will be taken to the office and a phone call home will be made. Excessive late pick-ups will result in the child needing to register for Extended Day, including paying the registration fee and any daily fees incurred.

Please make sure that your student knows if they are attending Homework Lab on each Tuesday and Thursday and if your child is in grades K-5, it would be a good idea to let the teacher know, as well, so everyone is on the same page, especially if the student typically takes the bus home.
