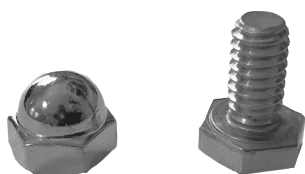

Sorry, but we **can't** take your support calls on assembling these seats, but the good news is that anyone of average technical ability ought to be able to assemble them with some patience (we've done it). This guide explains the basic assembly process.



You will need the following items for assembly of the two seats

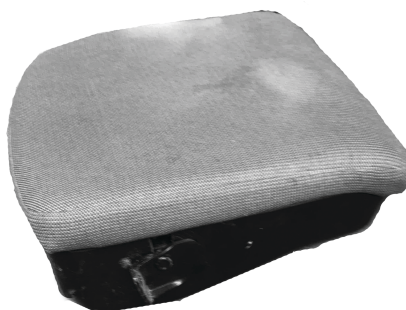


Smaller Bolt and Acorn Nut (6) - attaches seat back to stanchions. Bolt size is 1/4 -20 x 1".

Larger Bolt (4) - attaches seat base to stanchions. Bolt is 5/16-18 x1".



Seat Base(2)



Stanchion (3 needed for a two seat assembly) - cup rests optional

Seat Back (2)

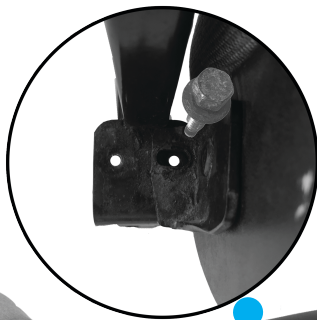


Suggested Tools for Assembly

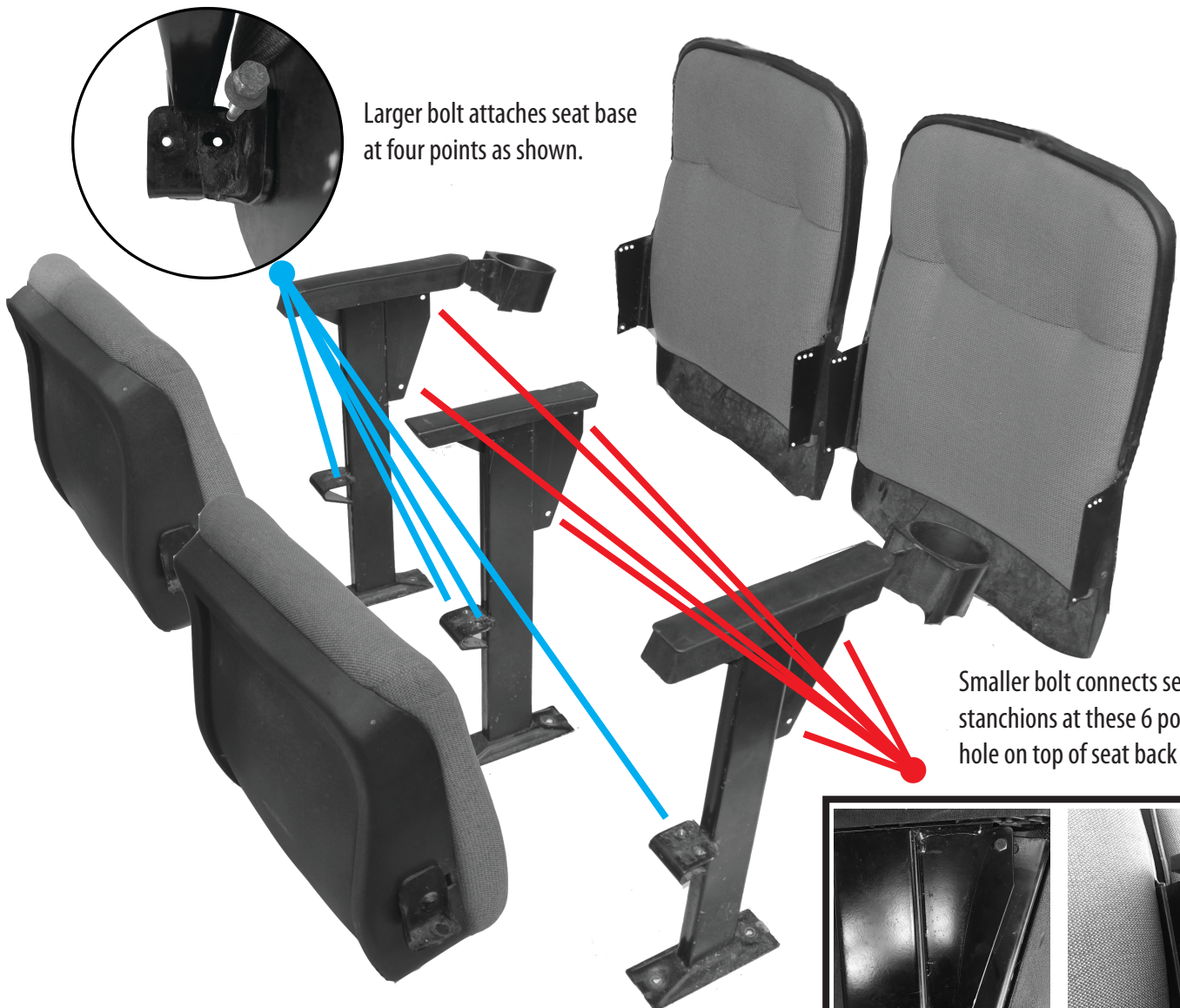


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Exploded View of Seat Assembly



Larger bolt attaches seat base at four points as shown.



Smaller bolt connects seat backs to stanchions at these 6 points. Middle hole on top of seat back mount is used.



Suggested Assembly Process

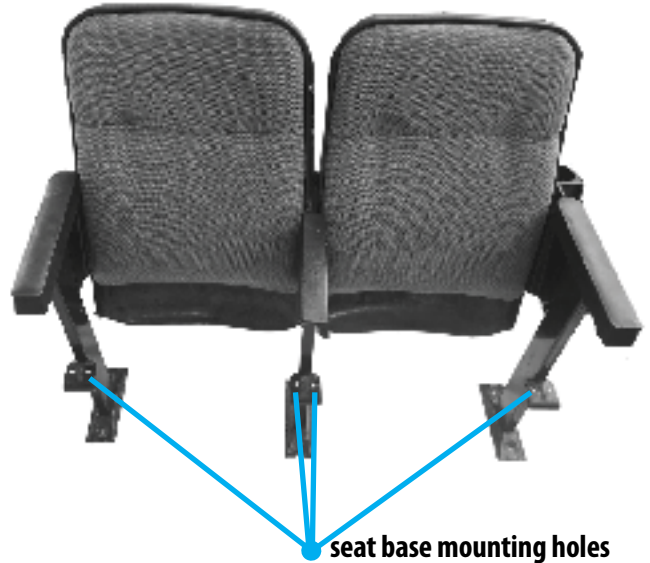
- ① With seat backs on ground, attach the three stanchions with the 6 smaller bolts and acorn nuts.

The stanchion in the middle needs to have the bolts and nuts through **BOTH** seat backs. It helps to have someone hold the parts in place. We suggest you use the *middle* hole on the top part of the stanchion where there are three holes.

Flip the seats upright. You will need to prop them against a surface as they'll be tippy. Locate the seat base mounting holes on the middle part of the stanchions.

Attach the seat bases using one of the larger bolts on each side (4 in total for both seat bases). It will help if you use a socket with an extension of about 6" or so. Make sure the bolt is as tight as it can go. Recheck all bolts for tightness and adjust as needed.

The seat assembly is now complete **but they still need to be attached to a base before they are safe to use!** That is beyond the scope of these instructions.
