	Thick white, green or yellow discharge: Children will be sent home if they appear to have any thick white, green or yellow discharge. This is often indicative of a n infection and they must stay home the next day for observation. Before returning to school they will need an evaluation and diagnosis from their doctor in writing and at least 24 hours of treatment. If in fact they do not have an infection, we need a doctor's note with a diagnosis of exactly what it is with a clearance that nothing is contagious. The Department of Health and most doctors are of the opinion that once on antibiotics for 24 hours, the discharge is no longer contagious even though it may persist for up to two weeks.
[]	Common Cold Policy Children suffering from a common cold will be assessed on an individual basis. Factors of consideration include the developmental level of your child in congruence with our ability to limit the spread of germs. The younger your child, the more difficult it is to keep the spread of germs down. For example: hand to face contact, mouthing of toys, uncontrolled nasal discharge, uncovered sneezing and coughing.

Children must be free of nits and/or live lice to return to school. Children with checked prior to returning to their classroom in order to reduce the potential spread of lice. All children are periodically checked for head lice throughout the school year.
