

Rural southwestern Travis County residents who don't have the luxury of municipal water supply absolutely depend on their wells for water and are experiencing intermittent to permanent interruption of reliable water supply. This impacts both their quality of life and their property values. Regardless of the source of your water, all of us have a stake in protecting the Trinity aquifers. We can do without a lot of things but water isn't one of them. Commissioner Shea continued: "It's important to remind people of the drought of 2011 when Lake Travis and other drinking water supply reservoirs largely dried up. If the groundwater is also being depleted, people need to know both those water supplies are being stressed. And
