Where does the unit come in the academic year (beginning, middle, end)	Beginning
Unit Goals and Contexts	
-lower level: Students should be able to identify key elements of the story: main idea, supporting detailsintermediate level: Students can retell the story and reference their own friendship problemsadvanced level: Students can relate to their own experience and create their own stories.	
Cultural products, practices, and perspectives	-Teachers can ask students to do culture "show and tell", bring any culture props from home to present to class. -Teachers can bring a "chopstick" or any Chinese food to class to show the culture differences in the classroom.
Communities	Friend circle: ask students who's in their friend circle and why? Have students share 1 thing from their peers that makes them friends. Talk about what makes friendship and what that means to you. Personality bubble: have students list 5 of their personalities/hobbies/interests/how people describe them on paper, and find the same words/phrases among class, see who has the most in common. Role Play: have students role play the story, furthermore, teachers give scenarios of different school days, ask students how to show support to each other.
