FROM THE PODIUM

When I think of spring in lowa, the first thing that comes to mind is wind, rain, and even snow. Once we make it through the early parts of spring, however, the outdoors start to become more green and alive. One morning, very soon, we'll wake up, look outside, and it will feel as if this change happened overnight! Spring often is described as a time of transformation, and this is a strong theme embedded in our upcoming performance.

We will sing pieces that emphasize the beauty of life, but also its challenges. Dan Forrest's "The Music of Living" expresses a desire to embrace the full spectrum of human emotions, including laughter and tears. The text of "Earth Song" by Frank Ticheli speaks of environmental and climate justice, and emphasizes the power of music as a comforting force and a refuge.

At the heart of this program is *The Sunrise Mass*, by Norwegian composer Ola Gjeilo. This four-movement work takes us on a journey from heaven gradually down to earth. Commonly, a traditional requiem is the opposite, ending in

heaven. Gjeilo wanted this piece to become more human, solid and grounded, as it progresses. What I love about this piece is it is engaging for any and all listeners. Whether you attend choral masterwork concerts frequently, or if you consider yourself a less-musical person, I truly believe you will enjoy this work. There is a cinematic style within it, and Gjeilo states that the Mass was partly inspired by Howard Shore's film score for Lord of the Rings. With titles like "The Sunrise" and "The City" for movements 2 and 3, you will likely hear the moment the sun appears over the horizon, and you may recognize the hustle and bustle of a city at the start and throughout movement 3. The musical imagery within this piece is genius and captivating. The final movement is titled "Identity." Here, we have found the mature sense of self, and our journey nears its conclusion through a beautiful chorale section, informally titled "The Ground".

On a personal note, I am in the process of my own transformation, as I pursue a new career opportunity over in Waverly, IA, as its next high school choir director. This will be my last concert at the podium for Fort Dodge Choral Society. I could not have imagined a more beautiful, transcending set of music to present to you all. It resonates with my heart deeply. This is a special group of humans that emphasize community, collaboration, and excellent music making. Please consider joining us for this final concert of the year.


