Kirke Mechem, composer of *Seven Joys of Christmas*, is often called the dean of American choral composers, who combines high artistic integrity with the ability to communicate directly with performers and audience. His *Seven Joys of Christmas* was written in Christmas 1964 for the Chamber Singers of San Francisco College for Women. The piece was dedicated to the famous British choral composer and

conductor, Randall Thompson, "with affection, and in admiration of a lifetime devoted to the joy of song." Mechem set out with the goal of setting lesser-known, attractive carols from different countries, including England, France, Germany, Japan and Spain, to paint different aspects of Christmas joy. The final carol, God bless the master of this house, is an amusing combination of all the carols in the composition, along with other well-known Christmastide melodies - familiar Christmas tunes, all piled fantastically on top of one another in a wonderful witty shout of joy.



Mechem work, we will feature pieces by Dan Forrest, John Rutter, and Shawn Kirchner. In the spirit of The Joy of Traditions, there will once again be a carol sing-along starting 15 minutes before the performance, and our small gift to you will be a bag of popcorn from Noble Popcorn in Sac City as you depart. I wish you moments of joy in the coming weeks and hope to see you for an afternoon of merriment and music on Sunday, December 22nd.



twice and recently lost his lovely wife Susan to cancer. They loved to travel together, collect antiques, and share music.


Mark has three children and two stepchildren; his son Benjamin followed his father into the medical profession as a surgeon.
