A Vision to Complete

Seven years ago God placed a project on Bro. Ben's heart that when completed, would bring great joy to the lives of children that have been emotionally impacted by traumatic events.

Long hours were invested by Bro. Ben in dozing out a deep fish pond on the campus. The plan was to stock the pond with fish and children with special needs would experience easily catching fish from the pond. Unfortunately over these seven years since it was constructed the pond has leaked and would not hold

water to full capacity. It therefore, could not be stocked with fish and the project was put on hold while we planned the next steps.

As the project resumes, water has been pumped from the pond and it is now being cleaned of accumulated silt. The plan is to place a liner in the pond along with a coating of clay. The liner, clay and equipment use will cost in the thousands of dollars. A small grant has been received to help complete this project, but several thousand more dollars are needed.

Over the years we have had our share of hardships but God has always provided as we turn to Him. As the clock ticked down to the start of camp we were once again reminded that our plans are not always His plans.

Kyle and Courtney Wolverton, our camp directors who had been here just 3 months, abruptly announced that they were being called elsewhere and were leaving. Their announcement was delivered just 2 hours before the start of summer staff training and needless to say, we were stunned. All of our plans for leadership went out the window. As we struggled to figure out what to do, we could only turn to God.

As we began staff training that evening we knew we had no choice but to announce the Wolverton's departure. "We can't explain it", we told the staff, "but who are we to question God".

We continued on with a time of introductions of all of the camp residents, staff and family members. One of those being introduced was Buddy Pearson, the husband of camp Community Outreach Coordinator,

Amy. Afterwards we took a short break and the Pearsons headed out to return to their home in Cookeville as planned. "Before we could even get to the entrance gate" Buddy later related, "I began to weep as God told me that he wanted Amy and I to apply to fill the new vacancy left by the Wolvertons". The Pearsons immediately returned to the training group where we had begun our evening worship. Even with the earlier bad news, the spirit of God was so strong and sweet that evening.

At the end of the evening as everyone left, the Pearsons approached Executive Director, Michael Kilgore and Buddy abruptly asked "so, what do I need to do to apply for the Camp Director position?" Michael was at first taken aback. Buddy had a great job at TN. Tech as their Communications Director. Without even thinking he responded, "Buddy you don't want to do this". But Buddy was adamant! Michael and the Pearsons went and sat in a nearby Gazebo in the dark of night and talked about camp, the open position

and how Buddy and Amy felt God was leading them. For some time, the couple had been questioning God's plan for their lives. Buddy had been ordained into ministry in the spring of 2020. He continued to work at TN Tech and began to preach at the Cookeville Rescue Mission and at local churches whenever opportunities arose. They put their home up for sale in May so that they could be ready to go whenever God called. The home sold the first day and the couple made plans for temporary housing as they waited on God. And now... He had spoken.

After a lengthy discussion and prayer it was agreed that Buddy would take some available time off work, attend the rest of staff

training and serve as an interim camp director for the first few weeks of camp to see how things would go. There was never a doubt for Buddy and Amy as they immediately fell in love with the children, counselors, volunteers and everything at camp. They were thrilled to finally be fulfilling their dream of serving in ministry together. By the end of the second week it was evident that the Pearsons had been called. At the Thursday night campfire, with leaderships blessing, all of the counselors gathered together and made the offer to the Pearsons to join camp in full-time ministry. With great emotion, they accepted! Praise the Lord!

Buddy and Amy have now settled in and made Camp I their home. After summer staff training and 7 weeks of camp, they are excited to see the discipleship process of campers begin.

Vhat Happens Now?

We are grateful to God for the children He sent to camp this year. While here they experienced devotions at each activity, prayed before every meal, attended chapel twice a day, learned bible verses and had nightly devotions before bed. These children spent a week at Lighthouse Christian Camp immersed in God's word and covered by the prayers of numerous people of God around the country.

We rejoice that many came under conviction and called upon the Lord for forgiveness and made the decision for salvation. A multitude of others rededicated their lives.

So.... what happens now? It's simply not enough to bring these children to camp once a year and then have them return to the same old lives where often they're unchurched, rarely study Gods word and have little interaction with Christians. God expects us



to do more! He expects us to disciple them, to help them mature in their faith, get plugged into a church and to teach them how to live a successful, joyous life in Christ.

Jesus tells us in Matthew 28:19-20 "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, **teaching them** to observe all things that I have commanded you". We are to teach... and disciple!

We strive to minister to and disciple the children God brings to us, not only during the summer, but year-round. We do this in many ways. Below are just a few.

Weekend Retreats

These "mini-camps" are held every other weekend for most of the year from 6:00 PM on Friday through noon on Saturday. While here the children reconnect with staff and volunteers they met during the summer. They eat healthy meals, attend worship and chapel, participate in fantastic activities and once again experience the love of Christians who care about their relationship with our Father. WE NEED YOUR HELP! Without volunteers to help with the children at these retreats, we can only disciple a hand full at a time. A commitment of just 18 hours (6:00PM Friday-Noon on Saturday) can make a world of difference to these children. For more information contact the camp office.

After-School-Club Program

Every Tuesday afternoon, when schools are in session, Lighthouse buses and vans travel to Dekalb County schools to pick up children enrolled in our After-School-Club discipleship program. These children, who have all previously attended camp range in ages from 9 to 17. While at camp, they eat a nutritious hot meal, get help with their homework, participate in a short bible study, worship and chapel and get to have fun interacting with other campers, staff and volunteers from the summer. Shortly after 5:00 PM we take the children to a central meeting place at one of the schools where their parent or guardian picks them up. WE NEED YOUR HELP! If you would like to assist on a Tuesday afternoon from 2-5, please call us.

Unfortunately, due to time and distance we are not able to offer this program in the other counties we serve. If you would like information and/or assistance in starting an After-School-Club Program in your area please contact us.

Homes, who administrate our cases, reserve our homes for those siblings who would have to be split up were our homes not available. This can be difficult for our families as they wait for God to send these larger groups in need our way.

Although Tom continues to work and build his home inspection business, he has taken every Wednesday off during camp to fill the need of boat driver for our pontoon activities.
