LIGHTHOUSE CHRISTIAN CAMP



SING FOR JOY WIDOW'S HOMES



Siblings in foster care are often separated into different foster homes and sometimes permanently separated through adoption.

The mission is to provide long-term homes for children in foster care if children are unable to be reunited with their family, and to adopt if available.

PASTOR'S RETREAT HOME



A beautiful spacious home is provided for pastors and their wives and families to use as a wonderful getaway to recuperate from the challenges of ministry. With magnificent views of the camp and Center Hill Lake, the retreat home offers much relaxation to those who come.

A game room equipped with billiards, ping pong, and foosball provides families a great place to reconnect. The home's close proximity to camp offers many other activities and amenities which will allow these families a place to get together or to get alone with God.

It Began with an Encounter at the Cross

Ben and Ermeda Chapman were married in 1964, purchased a large hill farm on Center Hill Lake in 1965 and constructed their first home on the property in 1967.

By 1973 the couple had one young child, three-year-old, Justin, and another baby, (Sloan), on the way. Ermeda, a college graduate, had served as an executive secretary for years, but now was a stay-at-home mom. Ben was the Resource Manager at Center Hill Lake but spent his free time improving the cattle and horse farm, with Ermeda assisting in every way.

Sundays were no different than Saturdays for Ben and he didn't consider he had time for church, but he would encourage Ermeda to attend a church down the road. Ermeda's response was always the same, "I'll go if you'll go".

Ermeda attended a Catholic school from first to eighth grade and graduated with honors from Joelton High School. In one of the services at the Catholic church, the priest said, "You must personally ask the Lord Jesus Christ to be your Lord and Savior. When Ermeda got home later that day, she spoke directly to God and said, "Lord, I want to do that".

Ben finally agreed to go to church and figured he would get the family plugged in and then sneak away and get back to work. After attending a short time, the pastor and a few men from the church came to the Chapman house to visit. It was during that September visit that Bro. Ben knelt on the living room floor of his home and said, "God let me have it".

Ben and Ermeda's individual encounter with the cross was where this ministry began. Soon afterward, Bro. Ben was called to preach and then pastor with Ermeda serving beside him. Later God called Bro. Ben and Ms. Ermeda to form Lighthouse Christian Camp and, in 1983, God spoke loud and clear that this was forever to be a place for the lost, the unloved, the forgotten. A place for those who, unless they could come for free, would have most likely never enjoyed the experience of a week of summer camp. Later God added a ministry to widows known as the Sing for Joy Widows' Homes. In 2008, God added to the ministry again with the Lighthouse Boys' and Girls' Ranch Homes. God established the Pastors' Retreat Home in 2010. This ministry provides a place for pastors and their wives and families to use as a wonderful getaway to recuperate from the challenges of ministry. My Journey to the Cross

For Camper Jeannie Poore, the comfort and joy of the Cross seemed unreachable.

After being removed from her birth home at the age of 3, Jeannie was placed in 12 different foster homes over a 5-year period. During that time she experienced abuse, rejection and loneliness. A failed adoption made things even worse.

Finally, Jeannie was placed with Putnam County TN Special Ed teacher Julia Bowman. Ms. Julia had a special love for children which caused her to become a foster parent and also gave her a passion for volunteering at Lighthouse Christian Camp during the summer. When Jeannie was initially placed in the Bowman home there were several other foster children there as well as Ms. Julia's birth daughter Marlo.

It was through her placement with the Bowman family that Jeannie was introduced to Lighthouse Christian Camp in the summer of 1984. Little did she know that in less than a year she would be adopted and welcomed into Camp Founders Ben and Ermeda Chapmans family. Shortly after, in the summer of 1985, Jeannie was adopted again.... this time into the family of God when she gave her heart to Christ. In the years to come, as her relationship with Christ grew, Jeannie went on to serve as Junior counselor, counselor, camp cook, Ranch home parent and more.

In 1997 James Gribble JR (who later as he grew up would be nicknamed "too tall" because of his 6'6" stature) rode a church van onto the campus of Lighthouse Christian Camp for the very first time. James fondly remembers seeing the staff and volunteers standing in the driveway "like they had been waiting for me the whole time".

Little did young James realize that he would return to camp many times during the next 20 plus years. Attending in the beginning, as a camper, later as a junior counselor and counselor and many, many times since as a volunteer during summer camps and follow up programs.

Unlike most children when James first came to Lighthouse, he had already accepted Christ a few years before while watching a Christian TV program. Camp however helped him nail it down and to build his faith over the years as he watched countless others give their own hearts and lives to Jesus.

What do you most cherish about camp we asked? "The unconditional love and acceptance" James replies. "That which I received as a camper and later as a leader.... and that which I have been able to pass on to others while being on staff and volunteering at Lighthouse Christian Camp."

Today, James is husband to Jessica and father to two handsome young sons Alden and Malachi. He continues to volunteer at camp whenever he can and often schedules vacations and time off around camp activities.

The Cross Transforms Lives

"Lighthouse changed me - and I've never even been to camp." James Gribble Sr.'s Story.

For years, James Gribble Sr. sent four of his children to Lighthouse Christian Camp as he struggled in darkness.

"Each year they would return from camp changed. Changed by relationships, changed by Christ! During that time, men and women volunteering as counselors at Lighthouse were the role models that I should have been for them. Thank God because of those experiences and changes I saw in my kids – I was eventually changed myself and I have never even been to camp," said James Sr.


"After Christ saved me, I discovered how the Lord answered my children's prayers back when I was still lost. Several years sober and working at Freedom Ministries – a ministry for those who suffer from addiction, my son James "Too Tall" Junior stopped by to see me. I just happened to be beside a co-worker, Lee Smith. Lee didn't know Too Tall was my son but recognized him from years before when he served as a volunteer counselor at Lighthouse. Later, with tears in his eyes, Lee shared how each night at camp he would ask his campers for their prayer requests and would write their responses in his journal. Most nights Too Tall would respond "pray for my dad – he is lost and in a dark place." For years, Lee had continued to pray over those requests without realizing until that moment, his prayer for me had been answered."

Today, James Sr. is 15 years sober and working as a Recovery Coordinator in the Substance Abuse Solution department for UCHRA. His journey has included serving as a youth leader at the River Community Church, then with Freedom Ministries.



James and his wife Denise Gribble together have 10 kids and 15 grandkids with 2 on the way. "Life only gets 'gooder and gooder' from here!" says James of his life today.

When Christ calls His followers to take up their cross, He is calling us into a relationship for the long haul. Putnam County school teachers and sisters Raejean and Lisa Landis have been faithfully volunteering at camp since almost the beginning.

Over the years they have served as cabin leaders, county coordinators, kitchen helpers, financial supporters and more! The sisters have become family themselves to the staff and counselors at camp. "We always feel at home when we come to camp." the sisters stated.

"Lisa and I have such wonderful memories of girls in our cabins, many of whom we still see. Camp really taught us how to memorize scripture and share the gospel using the Romans Road" says Raejean.

Throughout their time serving in the ministry here, Lisa and Rae-jean have worked with thousands of camp children. They have gotten to know and invested in not only the campers but also campers' families. Now they often have the opportunity to share the message of the cross with those camper's children and even grandchildren. "Often when we call to sign up children for camp we hear - do you remember when you signed me up for camp? Now I want my child to go!" What a blessing it is to see these children now grown up around town working in stores, at the hospital or as pastors at a local church."

As Christians, we know that carrying your cross can be laborious but it is the joy during and at the end of the journey that makes it well worth it. "Once you are at camp, and you're able to share and participate— the fatigue and exhaustion fade when you hear a child pray and accept God or see their smiling faces because they are truly happy to be somewhere where they are loved and accepted."

For 11 year old Jonathan Able the transformation at the cross wasn't immediate. Although he attended camp for the first time in July of 2006, he had made no commitment to Christ. That year Jonathan's counselor noted "He is a good kid, very competitive and easy to talk to". Still, throughout that summer, Jonathan made no decision for Christ.

Returning for camp in 2007 Jonathan was much the same... competitive but eager to please, somewhat quiet and a good listener. As of Thursday afternoon as with the previous year, Jonathan had not yet responded during any of the previous chapels.

For Thursday night chapel the plan was to build and erect a cross and to allow the boys to write down their hurts, anger, guilt and sin and surrender them to Christ by physically nailing their slips of paper to the newly built cross.

During the service the Holy Spirit began to tug on Jonathan's heart like never before. He knew this was his time.... and as he reflected on his own sin, wrote things down and nailed them to that cross. Jonathan surrendered.

The chapel service continued for what seemed like a long time. With the moving of the spirit there was much repentance, much weeping and much rejoicing. Just as with many before him, Jonathan's life was forever changed at the cross.

Today Jonathan is married to his wife Chelsea and works part-time as a custodian for the school system while he pursues his career as a writer.





Overcoming Trials by the Power of the Cross

By 9 years old, Kasey Tanner had already experienced much in his life. Born with an eyesight impairment, and subjected to abuse and bullying during his childhood, Kasey had to learn to fight and that is how he first came to camp - a fighter. It was that same fighting spirit that got him sent home early that first year.

During this time a dear camp volunteer Burt Handschin began to intervene, dig in and share how much Christ loved Kasey.





his last year as a camper.

Burt would pick him up and bring him to the church's Awana Club, camp retreats and back to summer camps. It was through Burt and other servants that he finally let down his defenses and really began to see the love that Christ has for Him.

Battling self doubt, the power of the Cross began changing Kasey. Year after year the Lord used staff and volunteers to love, accept and encourage him. He developed leadership skills that would equip him to later serve on staff and pour himself into others.

Kasey states that it was his time at camp and the transforming power of Christ that gives him the strength and confidence to overcome his difficult past and disability. God uses Kasey to talk to kids coming up in difficult circumstances or with their own disabilities about how the cross can set them free.

Today, in addition to volunteering at camp, Kasey serves as the Audio and Visual Director at Stevens Street Baptist Church in Cookeville. Kasev also is undergoing procedures to improve his eyesight.

The Confident Life Found in the Cross

Kris Sutherly's encounter with the Cross led him from being a shy young man to serve in the Marines and to his current place in life as an ER physician. As he did with Kris, God uses many people to be a part of a person's ongoing testimony of the life changing power of the cross.

"I was 10 years old in 1989 when I was invited to Lighthouse Christian Camp. During that first week of camp I especially remember going out in the paddleboat with my counselor Lee and he asked me if I had accepted God into my life. Unlike many of my fellow campers I had grown up attending church. I learned from a young age that God is the creator of everything and the Father of Jesus who died for the atonement of our sins. What I didn't know

until Lee talked to me was that I had taken this for granted and never KNOWN that Jesus was standing by for me to accept Him and have a personal relationship with Him and that it was MY sins that Jesus bore on the cross. I accepted Christ that week."

"A quiet kid who lacked confidence and was picked on at school, I spent as much time as I could at camp where I felt loved and accepted and where Bro. Ben and the Chapman family made me feel like I was one of their own."

"A second life changing moment came when Brother Ben asked me to share at Chapel. Speaking to those campers and sharing Christ gave me such a lift of confidence that continues to who I am today."

"What I wanted to do as a teenager was often in direct conflict with what I was supposed to do as a counselor and my commitment to be an example of Christ. I was not perfect but Brother Ben didn't leave me to fend for myself. He continued to invite me back and he showed me what it means to forgive and to love and to always grow in Christ."

"As long as I live, I will never forget the great times I had at Lighthouse Christian Camp, the walk to Christ that the camp provided me and the lessons I have learned; to do what is right and to seek forgiveness when I fail. Thousands of childrens' lives are forever changed like mine has been over the last 40 years and I pray, God willing, that Lighthouse Christian Camp carries on another 40 years to continue His work."

The Cross that Conquers!

In 1998, 10 year-old Beth Jones was invited to camp by a close friend. "For two economically challenged and emotionally damaged children, the chance to go to a free camp with plenty of food and a reprieve from our discordant homes was a dream come true" said Beth.

"Even once at camp, I was convinced that something would happen at home that would mean that I would have to leave early. Because in my life, chaos was normal."

At camp Beth enjoyed arts and crafts, canoeing and swimming and other camp activities. "One night at chapel, I found myself totally convinced that Jesus had something I needed. I went back during the invitation and accepted Christ into my heart."

"At the end of the week I tearfully left camp, dreading going home, but knowing things that I had not known before. I was a believer in Christ. I took Him at His word. As I grew up, God's presence was constant, and He began to give me a vision for my life."
