Gym Gets Much Needed Upgrade



One of the more difficult buildings to maintain here at camp is the multipurpose building or "Gym". Built in 1989, the steel framed building structure has provided challenges over the years. The large building is a vital part of the ministries here and is used year-round for After School Clubs, weekend retreats and more. Unfortunately the elements are tough on this type of structure and we have struggled with maintaining failing windows, a leaky roof and the absence of

air- conditioning in the gymnasium area itself.

In 2019 we were blessed to have a donor give a designated gift to replace many of the 30-year old windows in the building as well as to help buy materials for a beautiful new porch which was built by our Wisconsin Family...Faith in Action.

Fellow Wisconsinites and longtime friends of many of the Faith in Action group are Reid and Deana Ribble who now reside here just a few miles from camp. Reid, who is a former U.S. Congressman, also spent many years in the commercial roofing business. Ms. Deana who is a consummate organizer has volunteered countless hours in the past and especially this year sorting through donations in preparation for the Christmas parties. One of her many talents and passions is pulling together and organizing small items and then making the beautiful gift bags and baskets the children get to choose from during the parties. After her many hours in the camp's sorting room Ms. Deana became aware of some of the needs especially in the area of the leaking gym roof. She eventually mentioned it to Reid who later came out to lend his expertise. After inspecting the roof and attempting to make some repairs he quickly decided that much more would be needed to do the job right. The gym needed a new roof. When he communicated this to Ms. Deana she began, as Reid puts it "insistently encouraging him to get it done".

Reid then reached out to and began meeting with former business acquaintances and friends who he thought might support the project. Bruce Fryer, at Nashville's **Don Kennedy Roofing**, agreed to provide sheet metal and even the labor for the job. Steve Heaton, at **Atlas Roofing Corporation**, volunteered to provide the rigid insulation needed and finally, Scott Gipson, with **Fibertite Roofing Systems**, donated the roofing membrane needed to complete the work.

The job is complete and the building has a new 40 plus year roof. This enormous undertaking would not have been possible if not for God placing it on the hearts of first, the Ribbles and then on these Christ-minded companies. Thank you Father for this huge blessing!


In His Presence Remembering Sing For Joy's Carol Ann O'Clare

Now Taking Applications for New Widows Home

With the completion of the new widows home comes opportunities for new widows to join the ladies at Sing for Joy. We are currently taking applications for new residents in our widows ministry. Prospective widows should be at least 62 years of age, be self sufficient and able to care for themselves, and above all have a desire to continue to serve the Lord in their later years.

As a resident of Sing For Joy, widows are provided with their very own efficiency apartment complete with kitchen, living room, bedroom and bathroom. Each residence has a carport and a



private exterior entrance. Additionally each apartment has an interior door which connects with the homes "common area" where there is a laundry room, full kitchen with dining area and living room for residents who desire to get together for a meal, an evening of TV or games and fellowship.

Sing for Joy residents have unlimited opportunities to serve in the ministries of Lighthouse. These include: mentoring and leading small groups of children, cooking or serving meals, cleaning and other preparation before and after events, sorting donations and more.

Rent is just \$130 per month and all property maintenance and upkeep is taken care of by the staff and volunteers of Lighthouse Christian Camp.

After calling for emergency services, staff and volunteers alike began battling the blaze to protect the home from being overtaken. When county firefighters (two brush trucks and a pumper along with EMS) arrived they immediately sprung into action to get things under control. Just minutes later crews from the Tennessee Division of Forestry arrived and began extinguishing flames and creating firebreaks around the fire.

By 4:30 AM firefighters felt they had the fire safely

contained and left to go get some much needed sleep. Unfortunately, the wind picked up again and by mid-morning the fire began to rekindle requiring staff and volunteers to leave their families at church

and spring back into action to keep the fire contained. After things calmed down and we inspected the area around the new widows home, we found that the flames crept all the way up to the foundation. They not only went around small pieces of scrap lumber without igniting them but also a can of diesel fuel right next to the building. There is no other explanation...
