Silence and Whispers



1 Kings 19:8b-13,18 ICB [Mt. Carmel to Jezreel, to Beersheba to Jabal al-Lawz] [30+100+250 miles] "He walked to **Mount Sinai**, the mountain of God. There Elijah went into a cave and stayed all night. Then the Lord spoke His word to him: "Elijah! Why are you here?"

Elijah answered, "Lord, God of heaven's armies, I have always served you the best I could. But the people of Israel have broken their agreement with you. They have destroyed your altars. They have killed your prophets with swords. I am the **only** prophet left. And now they are trying to kill me, too!"

Then the Lord said to Elijah, "Go. Stand in front of me on the mountain. I will pass by you." Then a very strong wind blew. It caused the mountains to break apart. It broke apart large rocks in front of the Lord. But the Lord was **not** in the wind. After the wind, there was an earthquake. But the Lord was not in the earthquake. After the earthquake, there was a fire. But the Lord was not in the fire. After the fire, there was a quiet, gentle **voice**. When Elijah heard it, he covered his face with his coat. He went out and stood at the entrance to the cave.

[God] "But I have left **7,000** people living in Israel. Those **7,000** have never bowed down before Baal. Their mouths have never kissed his idol."



"Be **still** and know (recognize, understand) that I am God. I will be **exalted** (honored) among the nations! I will be **exalted** in the earth."

Isaiah 30:15-18 AMP

"For the Lord God, the Holy One of Israel has said this, "In returning [to Me] and rest you shall be saved; in quietness and confident trust is your strength."

But you were not willing, and you said, "No! We will flee on horses!" Therefore you will flee [from your enemies]! And [you said], "We will ride on swift horses!" Therefore those who pursue you shall be swift. A thousand of you will flee at the threat of one man; you will flee at the threat of five, until you are left like a flag on the top of a mountain, and like a signal on a hill.
