VETA Graduations

For some Students at FISCH, Vocational Training is an important avenue following on from early formal Education. It is a source of skill and character development, and many Vocational Students who complete their courses go on to gainful employment. In April we shared how four of our young men from FISCH were enrolled at VETA (Vocational Education and Training Authority) College, and how they were progressing in their courses. Well, we are thrilled to share

that they have completed their studies and have graduated! Salimu graduated from his Carpentry course, Bahati and Daniel both completed their studies in

Bahati and **Daniel** both completed their studies in Welding and Fabrication, and **Haruni** in Mechanics. Each young man was provided with a **suit tailored for them** by

the FISCH Sewing Team, and they attended their graduation ceremony at the end of November, joined by their teachers. Then after the FISCH Church service, the Team and Children at FISCH celebrated their success at the Drop-in-Centre, sharing specially-prepared cake, and a word of encouragement from Erasto, FISCH Operations Manager.

Gloria's Story 🌋

We'd love to share with you Gloria's story. **Gloria** was registered with FISCH back in 2009 when she was only 7 years old. Coming from a poor background, life was tough for her and her family, and so she was often found on the streets of Iringa. With FISCH's help and counselling, Gloria **returned home** and **back into school**, and with ongoing support she completed both her Primary and eventually Secondary Education.

Gloria is a caring individual; through her church she was involved with a **women's unity programme** which supported women with advice and social support; and she wanted to pursue a career in **nursing and midwifery** in order to serve the health needs of the vulnerable citizens in her community.

A Sponsor was found, and in 2021 Gloria was able to begin her **diploma** at a Nursing and Midwifery College over 200km away from Iringa. She studied for several years and after a lot of hard work, we are so happy to share that she **graduated in 2024**! Despite some health setbacks of her own, she went on to take the government nurse-accreditation exam, and although she didn't pass the first time, with extra graft and determination she pushed through and **attained her licence in May 2025. Congratulations Gloria**!

Gloria is now **working as an intern at a local hospital**. She is **happy** and enjoying work, giving back to the community. Wonderfully, she has job security, and with an income, she can now be **self-sufficient**; the mission of FISCH for all the Children we support, and it is a wonderful mission!

We must say a big **thank you** to Gloria's Sponsors, for her ongoing support, providing Gloria with more than a hope, but a future as well. **Thank you!**

Back To School...

Did you know? The academic year in Tanzania doesn't start in September like it does in the UK, but in **January?** Yes! We are coming to the end of one academic year, ready for the next one to begin in the New Year. This means that our Sewing Team are hard at work **creating hundreds of items of school uniform** to provide to our Children who are in Primary and Secondary Education.

Did you know? Although Primary Education is free in Tanzania, each pupil must provide their own uniform, school shoes, writing books, pens, pencils and school bags. If a child cannot procure this, they cannot go to school. This means that many FISCH Children whose families are living on the edge of poverty **simply cannot afford to send their Children to school**, because they do not have the finances to pay for these things.

Did you know? FISCH runs a School Uniform Fund. And it does exactly what it sounds like it does — it funds the provision of hundreds of school uniform items each year so that so many more Children can go to school and get an education. The Fund purchases reams of fabric so that the FISCH Sewing Class can create uniforms economically; it buys shoes for Children who would otherwise be barefoot and banned from school buildings; it purchases books, bags and stationery so that Children can receive an education, further themselves in life, and hopefully go on to additional training and one day become self-sufficient, the mission of FISCH.

Did you know? Every year we have superbly kind donations towards the School Uniform Fund (thank you!!), and we are so grateful for them – yet every year we utilise every last penny of the donations, because frankly we have that many Children going to School that have needs! So whilst it is wonderful to know that we are helping Children to get back into and to stay in School, and we rightly celebrate this, it is a huge challenge to provide for them all, every year. To supply each Child with everything they need costs £32. If you would like to get involved and make a donation towards the Uniform Fund, we'd be hugely grateful. A one-off donation or a monthly gift, either way we at FISCH would so appreciate it. We are expecting to provide for 180 Children the year alone!

Nelson Mandela is quoted as saying "Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world." He is right! The success stories you read above, of Salimu, Bahati, Daniel, Haruni and of Gloria, all started at Primary School and they worked their way up and out of the poverty that life had for them.
