Halfway Home

Do you remember a long time ago we mentioned the FISCH Halfway House? This allows children who would benefit from help to move from the streets back into family life gradually over a period of time. We have had several Children use this facility and recently 5 girls and 2 boys have been living at the Halfway Home. Pastor Stephano and Mama Stephano look after the Children at the Home. The FISCH Church pastor, Pastor Stephano, stays with the children in the morning and visits FISCH in the afternoon to help with the Homework Help Club. Mama Stephano works at FISCH during the morning, then swaps with her husband and looks after the children in the evening.

Pastor Stephano was originally based in Morogoro where he was looking after a Pentecostal Church of God church for over 15 years, before coming to join FISCH Ministries. We welcome him!
