I love to interact with the children, trying to guide, counsel and encourage them.


What have you learnt during this time?

Some of our long term supporters will remember Atu Magomba. Atu is one of the **founding members of FISCH**, and was a key member of the team for many years, before moving to South Africa 4 years ago with her husband Mote and three children.

Well, during that time Atu has invested her time to gain a degree in Social Science, Psychology and Sociology, and we are delighted to announce that she has returned to FISCH on a 6 month placement as Operations Manager.

Atu has made a significant sacrifice to do this, leaving behind her family in South Africa, to oversee FISCH during a key period of transition, as **we appoint a new Social worker and Patron** for the short term accommodation (more on this next quarter), as well as move into our new drop in centre. We are delighted to have her back!









Update from Evie (Educational Coordinator)

After spending 4 months at FISCH from January to May I returned to the UK with a heavy heart and a strong desire to get back to the project. I had been asked to be the Educational Coordinator for FISCH and thought that returning would help me be as effective as possible in the role by exploring any limitations and possible new initiatives.

I got back to Tanzania a month ago and it's been absolutely brilliant! We have been focusing a lot on nurturing the talents of specific children, from artists to scientists and introducing some new projects, such as hair braiding classes.

I was able to come at a time of great transition for FISCH, as the previous operations manager Stephano moved on and his replacement Atu arrived. This transition has been really exciting to watch, and I can see FISCH growing and becoming more and more powerful everyday.

I will sadly be returning to the UK shortly to begin my masters, but I will continue being involved with FISCH and hope to return at Christmas!
