## The Drop in Centre

Anyone who has been following FISCH will know we have been thinking and praying about 2 buildings for the project; a halfway house to serve as a sort of safe place for children to stay a couple of months and a drop in centre to serve the immediate needs of the children very much a part of street culture. Up until July FISCH was operating out of a rented office in the centre of town which while a blessing was not meeting the practical needs of the team and the children. After a lot of prayer and numerous site visits by Mote, God provided us with the opportunity to rent a large building in Iringa. With the help of generous donations we were able to secure the building for one year which will enable us to develop a model for running a drop in centre and get used to meeting the increased size of costs it will entail. It is good to have a reason to need to keep praying!! All the feeding projects, youth clubs, team meetings, basic medical care, equipment handouts and office work now happen at the drop in centre and it is a place the children seem to enjoy using as they know it belongs to

This summer there were two trips to Iringa. The first was lead by James and Kate Robinson....

Durham YFC took a team of 16 people, most aged between 15 and 22 to the FISCH project over the summer. The team arrived to a worn out building FISCH are renting for the new drop in site. They joined with local FISCH members and many man hours and tins of paint later all 13 rooms and front porch were complete and renovated. The team used tens of paintbrushes and rollers and litres of kerosene and ruined several T-shirts but all decided the hard work was worthwhile and thoroughly enjoyed running the feeding project on the final Saturday to meet some of the children and young people who will directly benefit. It is so good to be part of such a wide group of people who are interested in making a positive difference.

**Involvement with FISCH**: Alex approached FISCH for help with carpentry tools and equipment to establish a carpentry workshop in 2008. He had started to live on the streets when life at home got difficult but found life on the streets even worse. He was taken in by his Grandmother and was able to complete his education. But with no family to support him had no prospects after finishing school. He now has his own carpentry workshop.

**Future plans**: He plans to develop his workshop and to learn new skills. He sometimes helps out at the FISCH drop in centre and is a great encouragement to the current FISCH children
