Building for the future...

One of the biggest challenges faced by our team in Tanzania is how to address the immediate physical need of safe shelter for the street children. Whilst our aim is always to help them return to relatives where possible, or to live with a foster family, this process takes time and meanwhile these children remain sleeping on dirty streets at night without the basic provision of shelter.

To address this need, FISCH plans to build a 'half way house', a short distance from town, where children can find a safe refuge for a number of weeks whilst the process of praying, planning, counselling and reconciling continues to identify and enact a more sustainable solution.

We are currently in the process of identifying a suitable site, and hope to begin building over the summer months of 2010 as God provides! Please pray for this vision!

It is amazing to see the dedication of the Tanzanian team and their determination to help children and young people that no one else cares about. Visiting the St. Luke's project was a real encouragement, seeing the local church and FISCH in partnership, providing activities and particularly a big healthy meal for the kids was just brilliant.







Kate and I are looking forward to taking a group of young people out to Tanzania in the summer of 2010 to develop the work of FISCH and we're particularly excited about the possibility of helping to build a half way house for the street children who need a safe place to stay while family reconciliation takes place or a different home is found for them.

Alex - a street child that FISCH have worked closely with since we began. He has run away to Dar es Salam. Please pray that God will protect him and bring him safely back to Iringa.




Shazna - A street girl with no parents who has recently been taken in by Mote and Atu to live with them. Please pray for all of them as they adapt to their new situation.
