Food Parcels - What Are They About?



Each month we provide Food Parcels to **especially vulnerable Children** and their families, which consist of **maize flour**, **beans**, **rice**, **sugar** and **oil**. This means that each family and Child will be able to enjoy at least **one decent meal** a day, allowing them to focus on their studies or work.

Each Child is supported by a **Spensor** somewhere in the world. Our Food Parcel Co-ordinator **Sarah** connects each new Sponsor with a Child from the waiting list (which sadly, we often have), and is able to provide a profile of the Child to the Sponsor, providing regular feedback twice a year. We have so many Children benefitting from the Food Parcels, and the gratitude from the parents is truly humbling when they come to collect their life-giving Parcel.

The Sewing Club are continuing to learn and produce these items, improving their skills and abilities as they learn and practice. These items are then available for sale at the local Maasai Market next to the FISCH Drop-in-Centre, so any sales provide funds back into the Sewing Club, to purchase further material, and so on.

This is an excellent way for the Sewing Students to learn about **business** and **trade**, and we are so pleased for them!

Rich Gercke, co-founder of FISCH, visited Iringa in November 24 to spend some time with the Team and Children there. Here he shares his thoughts and feelings about visiting FISCH...

It was so good to be back in Iringa with the Team and Trustees of FISCH Tanzania. I can't believe that 17 years have passed since we started FISCH, beginning by just responding to a young street boy begging for money and settling for a cup of tea, breakfast and a chat with me in rather broken Kiswahili!

Every time I return to Iringa I am amazed by how much the city and country are developing. It remains a very special place filled with special people, sadly many of which are battling against poverty, and their focus is just to strive for a better life. I am always amazed at their kindness, warmth and joy in the face of these challenges.

It was wonderful to spend time together with our Tanzanian Trustees, who have really captured the vision and heart of FISCH to help these vulnerable Children. I am excited about how FISCH Trust in Tanzania will evolve over the coming years with this wonderful Team in place.

During my visit, I met with a number of members from the local community, as well as officials at various levels of local Government. Each of them was so thankful for the work FISCH is doing and
