FISCH Garden

At FISCH we believe we need to help the Kids by taking a "grassroots approach" – by this, we mean working from the root of the problem (for instance, lack of food within a household) and providing resolutions to these problems (for instance, Food Parcels) which then allow the Kids to stay at their family home, have the time and focus to go to school, learn, find employment and then provide for themselves and their family.

Well, the Kids and Team at FISCH have taken this approach literally! In February of this year, **FISCH Garden** was planted, firstly with **kale** and **mchicha** (similar to spinach) and then with mchicha again. The Garden is cared for by the Kids who are the in the Short Term Accommodation, who water it every morning and help **harvest** the crops. So far there have been **three harvests** of vegetables, and all of the produce has been used to supplement the Children's meals at the Drop-in-Centre. How brilliant is this?

Drop-In-Centre Building Update

Those of you who have been supporting us for a few years, will be aware that we completed the first building of a new Drop-In-Centre, thanks to the incredible support of the TSS Awareness Campaign (tssaware.org.uk), in memory of Natasha Scott. We are so grateful to Mike, Mandy, Jean and Dan, and all who have supported them in their fundraising efforts!

After completing the first building, plans for the second were put on hold as we assessed a **new opportunity** (see below), and considered how best to distribute FISCH's activities in light of that opportunity.



Vocational Training Centre and Accommodation



Late last year we met with an English couple called Simon and Grace, with careers in development and architecture, they were interested to explore how they could help fulfil our long term vision for both a Drop-in-Centre and Vocational Training Centre.

After visiting FISCH in April, they returned inspired and have offered their skills to help design both the second building at the Drop-in-Centre, and develop a new site which would include a Vocational Training Centre and Accommodation.

Therefore, I am excited to share that, with their help, over the next 2 years we hope to be completing both of these ambitious building projects. The Vocational Training Centre will be a place where Children can be equipped with skills such as tailoring, carpentry and basic agriculture, to supplement their education, and enhance their chances of employment in the future.

We will also have accommodation on the same site, where children who have no home may spend a short period whilst we seek to locate relatives, rehabilitate and reunite with families.

It is incredibly exciting that in a few years' time we may be able to provide even more homeless and vulnerable Children with more comprehensive support!

As God grows our capacity with respect to physical structures, the next step is to grow the human resources of volunteers in the UK in order to raise greater awareness and funding to enable us to make full use of our increased future capacity.

Uniform & Stationary Fundraiser

In Tanzania primary and secondary education at government schools is free from tuition fees. However barriers such as **uniform**, **exercise books** and **stationary costs** must still be overcome by the parents. For children who have no parents or come from very poor families where the priority is simply to put **food on the table**, these barriers prove too much, and children cannot attend school.

To help overcome this for FISCH kids, FISCH has a target to raise enough funds to provide up to 100 children with all the necessary uniform and stationary each year. Our target amounts to over £3,000, or £30 a child. We are seeking supporters to commit to give annually towards this cause, and so build up a fund which can be used each year to support these children. To get things moving, inspired by her trip to FISCH in January, Carolyn of the UK FISCH Team held a birthday party fundraiser, where guests were invited to give to this cause. Over £1,500 was raised which is fantastic! Thank you to all who gave, and thank you to Carolyn!

Recently the Drop-in-Centre hosted a "Parent's Meeting" with the Parents and Guardians of FISCH Kids and the Team in Iringa. The Team discussed how to offer the necessary moral support for Children with regards to staying in and continuing their education, and managing the rigours of growing up as a young person. There were also conversations about how Children who had been placed back into their families were getting on, and how as FISCH we could best work with their parents to ensure that the Kids settle into their homes and continue with their education. There was also discussion about capital support for those who would like to start small enterprises to support their rehoused Kids.

Food Parcels Update




Each month, some of our **Kids and their Families** receive Food Parcels. These are provided for by our kind Supporters who **\$ponsor** a Food Parcel each month, with currently over **30** Children being provided for! Each Parcel contains **maize flour, beans, sugar and cooking oil**. Providing a regular source of food and nutrition for a family has many **positive consequences** – family units stay together, Children stay off the Streets begging, go to school instead of working to bring an income in, and can focus on their studies better. This is an example of our "grassroots up" approach. Each \$ponsorship is £19.50 a month and you will receive an update on the Child receiving the Parcel twice a year.

Mohamad's Illness and Recovery



Recently one of our FISCH Kids contracted malaria. Malaria is spread by the bites of mosquitoes and it is a common problem in Tanzania. Iringa is in the southern highlands and so doesn't have as many mosquitoes compared to Dar es Salaam, on the lowland coast, but it is still a concern. Mohamad fell ill but was taken to the doctors and received medical attention at the hospital. His medical fees and the medications he was prescribed were covered by FISCH funds, and thankfully Mohamad has made a full recovery. He has also been re-connected with his family in Dar es Salaam. Mohamad and the Team are grateful for the support he has received from Supporters and Friends of FISCH.
