#### Sewing Club Update

The daily sewing training continues to grow, now with **9 dedicated Students**, a mix of boys and girls. The Club have been **making and repairing uniforms** for any FISCH Children as well as **face masks** for the FISCH community. Their teacher Eva also set them the challenge of designing their own uniforms, and some for the FISCH Choir group.

Up until now, the nine Students share five sewing machines, but thanks to generous support from an individual in the UK we are now able to **purchase an additional five machines** to take our total to ten. (Thank you to that person – you know who you are!)

As the success of this vocational training club grows, we are considering how we can best help these Students to **set up business when they graduate**. FISCH has already supported a number of Children to do this over the years, and we are researching whether we could rent retail space to do this on a larger scale in the future. Watch this space for further updates later in the year!



# **COVID-19 Impact Update**

We have continued to **closely monitor** the impact C19 has been having on the community we serve in the Iringa region. Our Team have observed an increase in sickness and people suffering with flu-like symptoms, and recently sadly an increase in the number of funerals within the community; however at this stage hospitals do not appear to be overwhelmed.

The Community we serve continue to suffer from the **wider economic impact** the reduction in international tourism has had on the Tanzanian economy.

We continue to provide increased supplies of **fresh water**, **medical** and **hygiene supplies**, as well as educate the Children about **how to protect themselves** from infection. Our Sewing Club have been making face masks for use within our community.

#### Welcome Bili!

Bili has recently joined the FISCH Team in Tanzania in the role of Admin Secretary. This is a new role that we have created to assist in delivering with feedback and communication from the Team in

Tanzania, the need for which has grown significantly over the last few years as we grow. We really believe in providing feedback and updates from the Project as much as possible,

so people can see the **results of** their prayers, support and

**financial giving**. Bili has also been responsible for taking many of the high quality photographs that you may have seen in our feedback or social media channels.

Sadly Bili will only be with us a short time while he waits to begin his University course, but we are delighted to have him with us nonetheless!

# Food Parcel Sponsorship Programme: An Update from Sarah

"What a joy it has been to see a growing number of Children coming off the waiting list and being supported with a monthly Food Parcel. We currently have 42 Children being supported in this way, thanks to the generosity of our sponsors. Over a period of time, we see Children growing up and thriving because they are no longer going hungry and they are able to focus on their education. As the co-ordinator for the programme, I have the privilege of seeing the big picture and I've been deeply impacted by the genuine hard work and commitment shown by many Children who are doing really well at school and going on to college and university and are on their way to fulfilling their dreams. A number of young men and women have gone onto Vocational Training and then have started their own business, arriving at a point where they become self-sufficient and no longer need support from FISCH in this particular way. Of course, the Tanzanian Team are a vital part of each Child's journey; working hard to distribute food, check on the family's situation and wellbeing and providing counselling for those who may be struggling in school or with family relationships.

### **Uniform & Stationery**

Regular readers will recall that every year we try to provide **uniform and stationery** for Children registered at FISCH who cannot afford these essential items. Without them they would be

denied access to government schools, and last year over 300 Kids were supported in this way.

In Tanzania the school year begins in January. Our target to provide these items again this year is £7,000, and so far we have received donations for about 40% of this target. We are still seeking further support for this, and if you have connections to schools or organisations who may like to **partmer** with FISCH, or if you yourself would like to contribute please do get in touch. # **Clarence and FISCH Zanzibar**

You may remember from our last newsletter about Clarence (see right). He was the **very first Street Child** that FISCH helped way back in **2007** and is now living and working in Zanzibar. We shared that Clarence, inspired by his own experiences and the help he received, has been **independently helping vulnerable Children from his community**.

We have been considering whether FISCH could support Clarence to build something more structured, and effectively open a **branch of FISCH in Zanzibar**. In the past couple of months Mote (who leads FISCH Trust in Tanzania) visited Zanzibar to assess the situation. His visit confirmed that there are a number of Children living in **very poor circumstances** on the island. Many families are struggling for food, and **Children turn to the beaches to beg**. Just like in Iringa, there is also a real need for education, with many Children dropping out of school due to lack of basics such as uniform and stationery.

Clarence has a big heart for these Children, and has already been doing a lot to encourage and support them. We are now assessing how much it would cost to run a **Saturday Feeding Project** for the Children within this community, with the intention of gradually introducing different **programs of support** for these Children as funds become available.

# **Vocational Training >**

As well as providing our own Sewing training at the FISCH Centre, we also support a number of Children into vocational training. This is a key area of provision for many of our Kids, for whom Higher Education is not an option and the mainstream schooling has no longer become appropriate. These short courses include Carpentry, Mechanics and Driving, among others.

• Over the years we have seen many young adults in the FISCH community gain skills in this way and become financially independent.

So far this year FISCH has supported **9 Children** to start these courses, and we anticipate a further 3 Children to begin courses this quarter. The cost of training typically costs between £100 - £250 per course.

This is an area of our ministry that we would love to grow our regular funding for, since at present it depends upon the availability of one-off donations. Feel free to contact us if you're interested in getting involved.

# **African Child Day Celebrations**

Every 16<sup>th</sup> June African Child Day is celebrated, to commemorate the Soweto Uprising which happened on this date in 1976. In Apartheid South Africa black school children led a demonstration to show their discontent to having Afrikaans introduced as a medium of instruction in local schools. This demonstration was met with brutal opposition from the State leadership; many children were shot and killed. Countries within the SADC (Southern Africa Development Community) honour this day as a reminder of painful history, but more importantly, as a reminder of the crucial importance of Children's rights and why it is an important duty to safeguard those rights.
