Celebrating FISCH Day – Happy 18th Birthday to FISCH!



FISCH started on 1st September back in 2007 - and since then, we have been seeking to witness the love of Christ to the Street Children of Iringa, to give them a hope and a future. God has been so so good – starting with just a Saturday Feeding Project, with a handful of Street Kids, a bible story, a kickaround with a ball, and of course a meal - to what we can serve the Children with now; a Drop-in-

Centre, Short-Term Accommodation, Breakfast Club, Education Support, Food Parcel Sponsorship, FISCH Church, FISCH Utd football club, Sewing Club, Vocational Training, After School Tuition Support, School Uniform Provision, Long Term Shelter Support - and of course the Saturday Feeding Project. School Lunch Fund Kickstarter - A UK-Tanzanian Effort



At FISCH we try to support Children back into Education, be that at School and College or through Vocational Training. There are many reasons Children are unable to go to school – although in Tanzania the government provides free Primary and Secondary education to Children, there are other costs that parents and guardians face, such as school uniform, stationary, school shoes. FISCH helps out wherever possible, be it by providing the uniform, stationary, fees, or other equipment required.

Something that we are looking to start providing for is the **provision of school lunches**. This is another financial burden on many families who already struggle, and it may be that a Child is able to go to school and have all the equipment and uniform, but then they are at school from 7am to 4pm with no meal in this time, and often a long walk to and from school, back home. In fact many Children get by on only one meal a day — and we can all agree that concentrating on an empty stomach is a challenge.

For this reason we are hoping to start up a School Lunch Fund – and it will do exactly what it sounds like it will do. It is a fund to help provide school lunches to those Children who need them. It's about 30p a meal, or £6 per month per Child – not much at all – but it will make a huge difference to the Child who gets to eat a proper meal at lunch time, for them to be able to concentrate on their studies better.

To help kickstart this School Lunch Fund, one of our UK Team members decided to raise sponsorship to run her first half marathon, and the Tanzanian Team decided to join in on the fun!

On Saturday 13th September, an **8-strong running team** from FISCH ran a **10k tour around Iringa**Town, decked out in FISCH t shirts and carrying a FISCH flag. Their theme for the marathon was

"Your hand is their hope" ("mkono wako ni matumaini yao") — an amazing reminder that through teamwork and a helping hand, these Children at FISCH stand a better chance at a happy, fulfilled life. The running team comprised of Erasto, Nassoro, Lazaro and Emiliana (Tanzanian Team Staff); Salim,

Zabron and Aloyce (FISCH beneficiaries); and Silvanus (a supporting community member). Together the eight of them covered the 10k distance, and amazingly made it onto three local TV channels, which then covered their race and interviewed them about FISCH and it's ministries!! How cool is that?!

On Sunday 28th September, it was Paige's turn. Paige is a long-standing Uk Team member who signed up to run Forest of Dean Autumn Half Marathon, raising sponsorship and awareness of FISCH in the months leading up to it. She finished the 13.1 miles through the Forest of Dean wearing a smile and the Tanzanian flag on her shoulders. Hoorah!

Between the Tanzanian Team and Paige, a huge £2,793.77 was raised! This is enough to provide 9,312 School Lunches for Children at FISCH – what an achievement!

We are hoping to build up this Fund, but that means many regular donations are needed to ensure we can pay for school lunches on an ongoing basis.
