IN RESPONSE TO DRESS STANDARD CLAIMS

To Whom it may concern:

On August 14, 2019, Ms. Madeleine Schmidt of the Colorado Times Recorder wrote a piece entitled "Ultra-Conservative Pastor Running for CO House Seat Thinks Women Shouldn't Wear Pants". This piece implied that as a pastor, Corey Seulean allegedly tells the women of his congregation how they are to dress. This claim is indeed in-factual with no real evidence to support it. Seulean does indeed believe that it is appropriate for men and women alike to dress in modest apparel; however, he has never told anyone how they are to personally dress.
