Mayor Smith opened the monthly meeting at 7:00 p.m.

Minutes of Prior Meeting

Councilman Carden made a motion to accept the May minutes as presented. He was seconded by Councilwoman Jackson. Councilman Wright concurred. Motion passed unanimously.

Financial Report

Councilman Wright made the motion to approve the June Financial Report. Councilman Carden seconded him. Councilwoman Jackson concurred. Motion passed unanimously.

Old Business

1. Update on Emails and Website – Mayor Smith apologized about the problems with setting up the emails. If troubles continue, he has a friend that could possibly help. Brittney, at Click Social Marketing will speak with GoDaddy about the ADA requirements for the website.

2. Update on Tree Ordinance –Councilman Carden reminded Council that the need for a tree ordinance came to light back when Dollar General wanted to build in the Town and needed to cut down two oak trees. We have received copies of ordinances from the Town of Brooks regarding tree protection and timbering. The Council noted that there were no fines associated with the timbering ordinance, but rather the possibility of not being issued a permit for 24 months, which, the mayor noted, is “the teeth” to the ordinance. Mayor Smith said that he would check with David Ballard regarding the difference between developers clearing the land and the individual property owner clearing the land. And if the owner then sells the land to a developer, does the developer have to wait the two years before the land is developed?

3. Transportation Update – There was no meeting of the Transportation Committee, Mayor Smith told the Council, but he had received notice from GMA that the Town is eligible for a LRA grant of \$1,500 and also an LMIG grant, which cannot be used for beautification, only road easements. Councilman Carden asked about sidewalk improvements and was told that we also have \$1,500 from a previous year’s grant. Carden noted that there are 2 to 3 areas of sidewalk that are in need of repair which are not part of the roundabout project. Mayor Smith said that he would see if the monies can be used for the repairs. Councilman Wright inquired about the costs for such repairs, but no one had a response. In other transportation issues, once again, someone ran the stop sign and ended up on Ronnie Thompson’s property. Councilman Wright commented that we need to see what the County says about this with the roundabout project.

4. Other - None

New Business

1. Other – Councilwoman Jackson has arranged for the Varsity food truck to be at the Community Center on the 4th of July for a community event and for Coney Mason to donate watermelon. Councilman Wright made a motion that the Town to fund up to \$2000 towards the community event on the 4th of July. He was seconded By Councilman Carden and Councilwoman Jackson concurred. Motion carried unanimously.

Finally, the mayor told the Council that notice was put out regarding the possibility of adding an LHOST or FLOST to the November ballot.

With no more business to come before the Council, Councilman Wright made a motion to adjourn the meeting. He was seconded by Councilman Carden. Councilwoman Jackson concurred. Motion passed unanimously.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:58 p.m.
