Mayor Smith opened the monthly meeting at 7:00 p.m.

Agenda Changes

Minutes of Prior Meeting

Councilman Wright made a motion to accept the April minutes as presented. He was seconded by Councilwoman Jackson. Councilman Carden concurred. Motion passed unanimously.

Financial Report

Councilman Wright made the motion to approve the May Financial Report. Councilman Carden seconded him. Councilwoman Jackson concurred. Motion passed unanimously.

Old Business

1. Update on Emails and Website – Mayor Smith reported that the website is up and running. There us a “bulletin board” on the page where announcement can be posted. The website developer, Brittney, charges \$95/month or \$29/hr. Decision made to go with the \$95 charge.
2. Update on Tree Ordinance –Councilman Carden made a motion to table this agenda item until the June meeting. Councilman Wright seconded him. Councilwoman Jackson concurred. Motion passed unanimously.
3. Transportation Update – Mayor Smith told the Council that he had spoken with Paola and that the County had decided to go ahead with the roundabout as approved at the March meeting. Councilman Carden asked if the alternative was even presented to the Commissioners and the Mayor responded that he did not know. The mayor also mentioned that the projections through 2050 show 2000 new homes in this part of the County. Councilman Carden noted that they are rezoning for smaller lot sizes, with an example being just north of Woolsey having 2-acre lots.

Mayor Smith also talked about Fayette Forward looking at 12-feet for golf cart paths, but the plan for Woolsey would be 8-feet and not a part of Fayette Forward.
4. Update on Friends of Historic Woolsey – The “Raise the Roof” campaign raised \$5,500 with the silent auction, Mayor Smith reported, and FOHW are close to finishing the roof. The Development Authority sent \$175,000 of grant money, with \$14,000 still left to be sent. FOHW has provided the Town with a quarterly report.
5. Resolution on Updates to the CIE and STWP – Councilman Carden made a motion to approve Resolution #2026-05. Councilman Wright seconded him. Councilwoman Jackson concurred. Motion passed unanimously.
6. Agreed Upon Procedures – Mayor Smith informed the Council that the same CPA will do the yearly report at the same price as last year.

7. Other - None

New Business

1. Proclamation of Professional Municipal Clerks Week – Councilman Wright made a motion to proclaim last week as Municipal Clerks Week on behalf of Stacey Collins. He was seconded by Councilwoman Jackson. Councilman Carden concurred. Motion passed unanimously.

2. Other - None

With no more business to come before the Council, Councilman Carden made a motion to adjourn the meeting. He was seconded by Councilman Wright. Councilwoman Jackson concurred. Motion passed unanimously.
