All Healthcare Institute offers programs that prepare graduates to apply for licensure or certification in the State of California. The disclosures below identify, for each program, the credential the program prepares graduates to seek, the agency that grants it, and the requirements for it. All Healthcare Institute does not grant licensure or certification, and completion of a program does not guarantee that a graduate will be licensed or certified.

Programs are approved for and designed to meet the requirements of the State of California only. All Healthcare Institute has not determined whether any program meets the educational requirements for licensure or certification in any other state or United States territory. A student who intends to seek licensure or certification outside California should contact that state's licensing agency before enrolling, and is encouraged to discuss it with the Program Director. If a student relocates during the program, the school will provide guidance on the effect of the move on licensure and on comparable programs and regulatory boards in the new location.

Criminal history may affect eligibility for licensure or certification in every program below. Does the program meet California requirements?

The Vocational Nursing curriculum meets the California educational requirements for vocational nurse licensure as governed by the BVNPT. The program is approved by the BVNPT, and graduates are eligible to apply to take the National Council Licensing Examination for Practical (Vocational) Nursing (NCLEX-PN®).

Requirements for the credential

- Minimum age of 17 years.
- Completion of the 12th grade of schooling or its equivalent.
- Graduation from a BVNPT-approved vocational nursing program of at least 1,530 hours.
- Successful completion of the NCLEX-PN® examination.
- Submission of a social security number to the Board prior to being scheduled for the examination, fingerprinting (Live Scan) with the application, and payment of the initial license fee.
- No act committed that, if committed by a licensed vocational nurse, would be grounds for disciplinary action.

Examination and award of the credential

NCLEX-PN®, administered for the BVNPT. Licensure is granted by the BVNPT, not by All Healthcare Institute; completion of the program does not guarantee licensure.

Requirements in other states

Nurse Assistant Training Program (162 clock hours) – Certificate

Does the program meet California requirements?

The Nurse Assistant Training Program is approved by the California Department of Public Health. On completion of the approved training program, graduates are qualified to take the Nurse Assistant competency evaluation through the National Nurse Aide Assessment Program (NNAAP).

Requirements for the credential

- Completion of the CDPH-approved 162-hour training program.
- Submission of form CDPH 283B and Live Scan fingerprinting on enrollment, with criminal background clearance through the CDPH Aide and Technician Certification Section.
- Passing both parts of the competency evaluation: the written (or oral) examination and the manual skills evaluation, within twenty-four (24) months of completing training, with up to three (3) attempts.

Examination and award of the credential

NNAAP Nurse Assistant competency evaluation, scheduled through the Regional Testing Center. Certification is granted by CDPH, not by All Healthcare Institute; completion of the program does not guarantee certification.

Requirements in other states

Home Health Aide Training Program (40 clock hours) – Certificate

Does the program meet California requirements?

The Home Health Aide Training Program is approved by the California Department of Public Health. On completion of the 40-hour training program, the school submits form CDPH 183 to the Aide and Technician Certification Section confirming that the student has met the required hours and training for certification.

Requirements for the credential

- Current California Certified Nurse Assistant certification, which is a prerequisite for admission.
- Completion of the CDPH-approved 40-hour training program.
- Live Scan fingerprinting and criminal background clearance through the CDPH Aide and Technician Certification Section.

Examination and award of the credential

No separate written examination is required. Certification is granted by CDPH on the basis of the school's submission; completion of the program does not guarantee certification.
