A RESOLUTION EXTENDING THE FBIC SHUTDOWN PERIOD AUTHORIZED IN FBIC RESOLUTION 202-2020; THE INCREASED CURFEW TIMES AND THE EARLY CLOSURE OF BUSINESSES TO MINIMIZE THE FURTHER SPREAD OF THE COVID-19 CORONAVIRUS TO PROTECT THE HEALTH AND SAFETY OF FORT BELKNAP INDIAN COMMUNITY MEMBERS AND RESIDENTS

WHEREAS, the Fort Belknap Indian Community Council is the governing body of the Gros Ventre and Assiniboine Tribes of the Fort Belknap Indian Community, Fort Belknap Indian Reservation, Montana, by the authority of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Fort Belknap Tribes approved on the 13 day of December 1935, and

WHEREAS, under the Constitution and By-Laws of the Fort Belknap Indian Community, the Community Council is charged with the duty of protecting the health, security and general welfare of the Fort Belknap Indian Community, and

WHEREAS, the Fort Belknap Indian Community (“FBIC”) Council continues to monitor the spread of the extremely dangerous COVID-19 coronavirus and take steps to minimize the impact of the pandemic on the health, safety, and wellbeing of the Gros Ventre and Assiniboine members of the Fort Belknap Indian Community and its residents and the Fort Belknap Indian Community; and,

WHEREAS, through FBIC Resolution No. 202-2020, the Fort Belknap Indian Community Council implemented a reservation-wide shut down upon the recommendation of the FBIC Incident Command Team, to be effective Friday, October 2, 2020, 12:00 a.m. until October 16, 2020 at 12:00 a.m; and,

WHEREAS, based upon the information gathered and the monitoring of the increasing number of COVID-19 coronavirus cases, the FBIC Incident Command Team has made a recommendation that the reservation-wide shutdown be extended for an additional two-week period; and,

WHEREAS, the FBIC Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the health and safety of FBIC members and residents, especially our vulnerable population, to extend the shutdown period for an additional two weeks.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Fort Belknap Indian Community hereby further extends the FBIC reservation-wide shutdown period directed in FBIC Resolution No.202-2020 for an additional two weeks, to end October 30, 2020 at 11:59 p.m.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Fort Belknap Indian Community Council extends the restrictions stated in FBIC Resolution No. 204-2020 including increasing the curfew hours to start at 9 P.M. instead of 10 P.M. and end at 6 A.M during the duration of the extended FBIC Shutdown and all other actions outlined in FBIC Resolution No. 204-2020.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that pursuant to FBIC Resolution No. 203-2020, all stores within the Fort Belknap Indian Community, including Martin's Store, Kwik Stop, Red Paint Creek Store


or any such establishment are directed to continue to close their businesses at 7:00 P.M. during the extension of the 14-day shutdown and designation as a “dry-reservation” remain in effect during the extended shutdown period.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Council Officers are hereby delegated the authority and responsibility to sign any and all documents necessary to effect this action.


