Your son or daughter has expressed interest in the North Central Montana Upward Bound Program. ## What is Upward Bound?

• Upward Bound is an academic program funded by the U.S. Department of Education. It is designed specifically to prepare qualifying students for college success.

#### How does a student qualify to participate in Upward Bound?

• Federal regulations require we serve students who meet federal "low income" family guidelines, and/or students who are from families where neither the father nor the mother has earned a college bachelor's degree. (Please see Fact Sheet)

# Are there any additionally requirements to participate in Upward Bound?

• Additionally, the North Central Montana Upward Bound Program selects students who are sincerely interested in going to college, do not have behavioral problems, and could benefit from the Upward Bound experience.

Applications will be accepted from all students; however students who are enrolled in the ninth or tenth grade, as well as from eighth graders who are enrolled in their last semester of middle school are the priority. Once selected to be an Upward Bound participant, students will be served through their high school graduation.

# What is Upward Bound?

The North Central Montana Upward Bound Program has been funded by the U.S. Department of Education through a proposal submitted by the Fort Belknap Education Department. The North Central Montana Upward Bound Program has been in existence since September 1, 1989. Upward Bound is designed to assist in preparing qualifying high school students for college.

# Who qualifies for Upward Bound?

Any high school student in the North Central Montana Upward Bound target school area who has completed the eighth (8<sup>th</sup>) grade, but has not yet entered their senior (12<sup>th</sup>) year, and between the ages of 13 and 19 years of age could be eligible. These students must also meet the low-income and/or first generation college student, (U.S. Department of Educations guidelines), and have a need for Upward Bound services. An application packet must be completed.

The term "low-income individual" means an individual whose family's taxable income for the preceding year did not exceed 150 percent of the poverty level amount.

The figures shown under family income represent amounts equal to 150 percent of the family income levels established by the Census Bureau for determining poverty status. The 2020 poverty guidelines are in effect as of January 15, 2020. Federal Register notice was published January 17, 2020

# What is having a "Need" for Upward Bound services?

Upward Bound students must have a need for Upward Bound services. Potential college bound students need support in order to successfully pursue a program of education beyond high school. A "Need" for the Upward Bound Program must be identified for each student. Some of the types of need are: 1) High school academic background, 2) Lack of exposure to educational/cultural opportunities, 3) Lack of access to or support from those who can provide information, insight, and advice concerning preparation for post-secondary education.

### What Services does Upward Bound provide students?

The Upward Bound Program has 2 components:

- 1) Academic Year Component Selected students will be required to participate in weekly tutor/advising sessions (which will be scheduled with the student and their tutor). These sessions will be conducted by experienced individuals, and are designed to assist students with academic contact clarification, academic advising, personal counseling, and career counseling. Also educational activities such as career day, college days, etc. the students will be expected to participate in a number of these. Students will be able to earn stipends.
- Summer Component The same selected students will be required to participate in a 6 week summer program at Northern Montana College. Non-bridge students (9<sup>th</sup> grade 11<sup>th</sup> grade) will be attending basic skills classes along with a few electives. These will be taught by certified instructors. Entertainment, recreational activities, trips, fun times, etc. will be scheduled on a daily basis. Students will be staying on campus during the week and going home on weekends. Bridge students (12<sup>th</sup> graders) will be taking college level courses and receiving credit. High school credit may be awarded upon successful completion. Students will be able to earn stipends in this component also.

#### How much does it cost to receive Upward Bound services?

All Upward Bound services are provided free of charge to all selected students. Tutoring, Summer Component lodging, food, travel, books, tuition, and most entertainment costs are covered by the Upward Bound Program.

# **Confidentiality Statement**

The personal information you give to the Upward Bound Program is given to the federal government (Department of Education). The information is protected by the Privacy Act. No one may see the information unless they work with or for the Upward Bound Program or are specifically authorized to determine if you are eligible to participate in the program and help the government to measure your success. The Department of Education has authority to gather information to help make Upward Bound a better program (20 USC 1231a).

Great Care is taken to make sure that the personal information collected on Upward Bound Students is kept confidential. Information or record relating to individual Upward Bound students or group(s) of students who are participating or have participated in Upward Bound projects shall not be disclosed to any person, group, agency, or organization without the expressed permission of the Director of the U.S. Department of Education.

# **Application Directions**

Student Selection will be based on *eligibility, potential*, and *need*. It is very important for each interested student to complete all parts of the student application packet. Read each page carefully, and complete parts that you are being asked to complete. You will need your Parents/Guardians signature on some of the forms, it will be your responsibility to get the forms to your parents, get the signatures and get the forms back to the school. Also, it is very important that your family's income is verified, so please attach the necessary information. You must select a teacher to complete a recommendation form on you, the same with the Counselor/Liaison form. When your application packet is complete, return it to the Upward Bound Advisor at your school or Upward Bound office.

#### **Students & Parent(s)/Guardian(s):**

In order for a student to participate in the Upward Bound program we have to determine if they meet the Federal eligibility requirements for participation. One of the requirements stipulates that we need to serve students whose parents, natural or adopted, do not have their four-year college degree. We determine this through a statement signed by the Parent(s)/Guardian(s).

Another requirement is to serve students from low income households. This is determined through a household's taxable, not gross, income. This is why we request income tax forms and other income information from whomever the student resides with which may be the parents or other legal guardian. This information is kept confidential and you only have to submit it this one time.

The *FAMILY INFORMATION* section can be found on page 4 and needs to be thoroughly completed by the parent/guardian. A signature is also required as an assurance of accuracy of information provided.

The *INCOME VERIFICATION* section can be found on page 5 and needs to be thoroughly completed by the parent/guardian. A signature is also required as an assurance of accuracy of information provided.

# **COMMITMENT CONTRACT**

North Central Montana Upward Bound Program (NCMTUB) is a unique partnership between you (the student), parents and/or guardians, UB staff and the high school officials. It is crucial that all parties involved share responsibility and work as a team to insure your success in the program. Please read the following commitments carefully, as the signatures below will indicate you understand the commitment Upward Bound expects.

#### Student Commitment - I agree to

- 1. Attend high school regularly; this includes classes, labs, and discussions. Regularly means every day unless you have extenuating circumstances that you have discussed with the Upward Bound staff so they can assist you through advocacy if needed.
- 2. Enroll in an academic rigorous schedule in accordance with the Montana University System.
- 3. Earn and/or maintain a cumulative 2.50GPA while in the program. Your GPA may be lower at the time of entry, but you must have the ability to achieve a 2.50GPA by the following semester.
- 4. Attend all weekly meetings and Saturday Academies with the Upward Bound staff. When you are unable to attend, you will check in with Upward Bound staff prior to the event.
- 5. Display behavior and attitudes that are respectful and appropriate for college success preparation.
- 6. Attend at *minimum two summer academies* before high school graduation.
- 7. If you fail to maintain the commitments listed above you will be on probationary status and must schedule a meeting with your assign Upward Bound Advisor to create an action plan. Depending on your action plan progress, your probationary status will be removed. Upon removal, you will be fully reinstated into the program; if the progress is satisfactory, you will be re-evaluated for continued probation. However, if satisfactory progress is not achieved you will face dismissal from the program for not upholding the commitments put forth in the contract.

# Parent or Legal Guardian Commitment - I agree to

- 1. Give permission for my child to participate in the North Central Montana Upward Bound Program (NCMTUB).
- 2. Support my child's involvement in the Upward Bound Program, assisting when necessary.
- 3. Attend Upward Bound activities involving parents or legal guardians throughout the year.

#### North Central MT Upward Bound Staff Commitment – I agree to

- 1. Meet with each student on a regular basis to provide information, tutoring, and activities that will help them to achieve their full potential.
- 2. Seek parental input and involvement in Upward Bound activities and planning when necessary.
