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

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

GRADE 3



PRIZES

We believe schools are key to nurturing young changemakers. To honour your role in fostering creativity, awareness, and learning, we're offering the following recognitions for participating schools:

Creative Catalyst School Award

Given to the school with the most innovative and impactful entries, recognizing excellence in artistic expression and mentorship.

Star School Award

Awarded to the school with the highest number of student participants, celebrating exceptional engagement and outreach.

The Impact School Circle

Presented to schools that register 25 or more students, acknowledging commitment to fostering creative participation.



- The competition is open to students enrolled in a registered and recognized school within India, spanning Grades 1 to 10 and divided into categories based on their grade levels.
- Only registered participants will be eligible for evaluation. Each participant is allowed to submit only one artwork for evaluation.
- Participants are free to use any art medium of their choice, including but not limited to pencils, crayons, watercolours, markers, or mixed media.
- All entries must be created on an A4-sized sheet. Participants must self-source their drawing materials, including the sheet.
- Participants are required to submit a clear, high-resolution photograph or scan of their artwork in JPG, JPEG, PNG, or PDF format. Further details for submission are provided under a separate section.
- The artwork must adhere to the assigned theme and should not contain any provocative, objectionable, or inappropriate content.
- The entry must be the participant's original work and must not infringe on any copyright or intellectual property laws applicable in the Republic of India.



Each submission must include a description of the artwork (15-30 words for Grades 1–5 and 50–100 words for Grades 6–10) that explains the participant's interpretation of the assigned topic. This description must be typed in the designated field of the submission form and must not be written directly on the artwork.


We strongly encourage submissions to be written in English to ensure fair evaluation. Participants who choose to write in another language must use a reliable third-party translation tool to convert their entry to English before submission. Scaena is not responsible for any mistranslations or loss of meaning during this process.

While parents, guardians, or teachers may assist younger students with typing, the ideas and expression must solely belong to the student. Any evidence of others composing the content on behalf of the participant will lead to immediate deeply disqualification. We encourage authentic self-expression and original thought from every student.

Participants may use AI tools to understand or research the assigned topic. However, Al must not be used for the ideation, generation, or enhancement of the artwork or the written description. Submissions must reflect the student's own creativity and understanding. Any violation will result in disqualification.

- By participating, entrants grant the organizers the right to use their artwork for promotional, educational, or non-commercial purposes with proper credit.
- Entries that do not meet the theme, guidelines, are plagiarised, or contain inappropriate content will be disqualified.
- Submissions will be reviewed by a panel of expert judges. The jury's decision will be final and binding. Artworks will be evaluated based on creativity and originality, relevance to the theme, and artistic execution and presentation.
- The organizers reserve the right to reject any entry deemed unsuitable or non-compliant with the rules. In unforeseen circumstances, they reserve the right to modify or withdraw the competition.
- Winners will be announced on the competition website and other communication channels. All participants will receive a digital certificate of participation.
- Submission of an entry implies acceptance of these rules and regulations by the participant and their guardians.

GUIDELINES

The registration fee is non-refundable under any circumstances, including but not limited to non-submission of artwork, withdrawal of participation or disqualification due to violations of any terms and conditions.

Registration is considered complete only after full payment of the registration fee. Participants will receive a confirmation email upon successful registration. However, if payment details are later found to be invalid during verification, the registration will be deemed invalid which will be informed via email.

Each student is allowed to register only once.

Multiple registrations by the same individual will result in disqualification, and the registration fee will not be refunded.

The participant must ensure they meet the eligibility criteria, including grade level and enrolment in a registered and recognised school within India. Failure to comply with these criteria will result in disqualification without a refund.

Registration is strictly non-transferable.
Participants cannot transfer their registration to another individual under any circumstances.

All details provided during registration, including name, grade, and contact information, must be correct and up-to-date. Appeals for change in data post registration shall not be processed and incorrect or misleading information may lead to disqualification.

GUIDELINES

Participants must adhere to the submission deadlines as communicated during the registration process. Late submissions will not be considered for evaluation, and no refunds will be issued for such cases.

The organisers reserve the right to reject any registration deemed incomplete, inappropriate, or non-compliant with these terms.

PROCESS

Participants who register successfully will receive an email with Unique Registration Number (URN) for identification and a submission link to submit their art work.

Participants are requested to retain their URN and enter it in the submission form for identification purposes.

The submission process will be facilitated using Google Forms. Participants need to login using their Gmail Account submitted during registration to access this form and attach their artwork. Login from another email, might lead to inaccurate data processing, leading to possible disadvantage.

NOTE: Please check your 'Spam Folder' regularly for event related communication, including URN and Submission Link, post registration.



GUIDELINES

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- The submission must be a clear, high-resolution image or scan of the artwork.

 Acceptable formats are PDF, JPG, or PNG, with a file size limit of 10 MB.
- Name your file as:
 <Registration Number>_<Grade_X>
 (Eg: 1001_Grade_2)
- Please retain your original artwork until results are released for verification.
- Submissions are considered final. Once submitted, entries cannot be edited or replaced.
- Late submissions will not be accepted under any circumstances. Participants are advised to ensure timely submission.
- Ensure the artwork is centred in the frame, well-lit, and free of shadows or distractions.
- The image must not be blurry, distorted, or cropped in a way that obscures any part of the artwork.
- If compressing the file to meet size limits, ensure the quality remains clear and legible.



GUIDELINES

- The submission must showcase only the artwork. Avoid including any background elements, borders, or additional objects.
- Submissions must reflect the participant's original work. Plagiarised or non-original entries will be disqualified.
- The participant must provide accurate and complete details in the submission form to facilitate smooth evaluation.
- Participants are solely responsible for ensuring that their submission adheres to all guidelines. Non-compliant entries may not be considered for evaluation.
- Participants will receive a confirmation email with a copy of their responses after successful submission. If you do not receive confirmation, please contact the organizers immediately.
