#	Criteria	Comments
1	Introduction draws the reader in with an anecdote, bold statement, descriptive language, and/or vivid imagery.	
2	Introduction tells the reader why they have chosen to explore this subject. What is their reason? Paraphrase it here.	
3	The student has established their authority in this field and thereby also established their credibility.	
4	The introduction has a thesis statement that tells the audience how learning about this comparison brings them value.	
5	The student has outlined the context or background information for the subject.	
6	The student demonstrates an understanding of audience and purpose. Who is their audience? Write it here.	

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7	The student has completely explored the comparative relationship. Their goal for the essay is fulfilled.	
7	Style: The student demonstrates a distinct and unique voice and style. Describe the writer's voice and style in the "comments" box to the right.	
8	Student has given their essay a title that speaks to the events or lesson of the narrative and that draws the reader in.	
9	MLA format: The student has formatted their essay according to MLA standards (font size, margins, double-spacing, page numbers, name).	
10	The concluding paragraph brings the essay to a close. No questions are left unanswered and the lesson has been conveyed successfully by the end.
